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



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

ut it's hard to believe this decadent yet delicate structure in which Pierce Brosnan so gallantly saved the life of Halle Berry is available for all to experience. Granted, it won't be exactly the same. Because the hotel is rebuilt every winter, it also evolves with a team of artists creating a different look each year. Which is why our images of this unique structure are already no more. These were the views which welcomed visitors to the hotel in winter 2006/2007. This year's masterpieces have yet to be unveiled.

ICEHOTEL is in the village Jukkasjärvi, 200 kilometres north of the Arctic Circle in Sweden. It is built from the frozen waters of the River Torne, which is covered with a metre-thick layer of ice in winter. When summer comes all that is left are memories and photographs.

Every year hand-picked Swedish and international guest artists are invited to create the decoration in certain rooms. The art they create is very special - the ice and the snow catch and reflect the light in a way that is quite unusual for sculptures.

In March and April, at the same time that last winter's ICEHOTEL starts melting down into water, tractors and special ice saws are used to saw out huge blocks of ice from the Torne

river. This ice is crystal clear because of the clean water, combined with a fast current, of the Torne.

The ice blocks are stored in the ICEHOTEL Art Centre until they are used in the construction work in November. The Art Centre itself is a 1500m2 freezer building, with an exhibition made of ice and snow, as well as igloos where you can spend the night - in the middle of summer.

Near the end of October the artists and construction workers start working. Snow cannons and front loaders shape the snow onto arched iron forms, some of them as big as 5m high and 6m wide. Pillars of ice are used to support these arches.

ICEHOTEL is the brainchild of tour operators Jukkas, who have been selling holidays in the region since the 1970's. The company focused on the summer season and the magnificent outdoor experiences offered by the land of the midnight sun. During the dark winters the river was frozen and the people of the small village went into hibernation. But as the 1990's approached, it was decided to turn things around.

Inspired by the work of visiting Japanese ice artists, in 1990 the French artist Jannot Derit was invited to have the opening of his exhibition in a specially built igloo on the frozen Torne River. The 6om2 building named Artic Hall attracted many curious visitors. One night a group of foreign guests, equipped with reindeer hides and sleeping bags, decided it would be a good idea to use the cylindrical shaped igloo as accommodation. The following morning they raved about the unique sensation of sleeping in an igloo. And so the concept of ICEHOTEL was born.

Jukkas became ICEHOTEL, and next month it will enter its 18th winter as a tourist attraction and work of art. Bedrooms are kept at around -5C. If outdoor temperatures fall below -3oC, then it may drop to -8C inside.

Every guest room is a work of art, named by the artist. So last winter tourists could be found laying down in Cyclic Vortex, Bubbleboil Swamp and Arctic Contrast. And when you're not chilling out in your room (sorry, but the pun had to be made!) there is always time to hang out in the Absolut Icebar or to reflect and meditate in the Ice church.


While the exterior to the hotel looks like an oversized igloo, it gives little clue as to what's inside. But the interior never disappoints. Guests describe walking through reception as like entering a world of beauty and fantasy.

Last year's Main Hall was a work named We Reap What We Sow by Swedish ice sculptor Tjåsa Gusfors. Majestic pillars towered from floor to ceiling, and an eye-catching chandelier hung delicately above a group of chairs sculpted by fellow Swede Jörgen Westin who named them Jessica – a flower in bloom. Smooth, flowing lines capture the organic essence of the chairs, each one representing two of the flower's petals.

Taking a peek inside some of the sumptuous suites on offer, The Helices

The hotel supplies guests with a snowsuit, hat, mittens and winter boots free of charge. But they advise bringing along thermal underwear, scarf, gloves and woollen socks too. Luggage can't even be taken into the rooms, because it will freeze. So suitcases are taken to a special holding area. You sleep in thermal sleeping bags on a special bed built of snow and ice, on reindeer skins.

evokes a feeling of being deep beneath the ocean. Designed by American's Doug Meerdink and David E Scott, it's not surprising to hear the pair are often asked to design for movies and TV shows.





Another room, Russian Art Nouveau, uses chisels and light to highlight the richness of stained glass, submerging guests in a magical and surreal world. It is the work of Rashid Sagadeev and Leonid Kopeikin who since 1992 have taken first prize in 10 international sculpting competitions. French artists Patrick Dallard and Santo Magonza contributed Hammam, a suite which blends the cold Arctic elements with the warmth of an early Arabic bathhouse.

The ICEHOTEL has warm accommodation as well as the ice cold rooms. For practical purposes – and presumably to prevent your extremities dropping off - guests usually stay one night in the ICEHOTEL proper, before retiring to a warm cabin, chalet or hotel room for the rest of their stay.

The hotel's restaurant is, as you can imagine, warm. And for that reason, it's about 100 metres away from the hotel. Since ICEHOTEL melts every spring, the exact number of rooms vary a little, but the building spans over 6000 m2. There are ice rooms, ice family rooms, ice suites and ice suites deluxe. Invited artists decorate each suite which are all unique.

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While the hotel gets up and running every December, it starts running for real around April 20, when the spring comes and the roof starts dripping. So now is the time to get your skis on and experience a force of nature before time, and the ice, quite literally runs out.







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Later this month almost 100 Islanders are due to set off on an incredible challenge to South East Asia to raise £330,000 for Jersey Hospice Care. After months of training and fundraising, participants in the Bedell Group Vietnam Challenge 2007 will be packing their bags and saying their goodbyes in preparation for flying to Hanoi on Saturday, 10th November. The 49km trek through Vietnam will take place in the Pu Luong Nature Reserve, an area of outstanding beauty and one usually unseen by tourists. Participants will walk through rich rain forest, limestone panoramas and magnificent rice terraces.

Katrina Bell, Hospice's fundraising manager says: 'We have been overwhelmed by the enthusiasm of those taking part in what promises to be our most exciting and adventurous challenge yet. Their fundraising efforts have been tireless over the past year and they are well on their way to reaching their £330,000 target an incredible achievement for them and wonderful news for one of the Island's most vital services.'

Re-focus yourself

Statistically 1 in 4 people suffer from a mental health problem, and whilst there are many effective treatments, living with or recovering from mental or emotional distress can affect a person's confindence, selfesteem and general feelings of self-worth.

The charity Jersey FOCUS on Mental Health, have established 'ReFocus Recovering and Revaluing', a project for people aged 18-40 who experience emotional or mental distress. Based at Astral House, Great Union Road, Re-Focus is a project that recycles, re-vamps, and reconstructs donated goods; furniture, home wares, clothing etc for re-sale. People will not only have the opportunity to learn or develop skillsinrecyclingandreconstruction, but also be able to work as part of a team in a fun, supported and flexible environment, boost their confidence and also receive support to move towards gaining employment or education.

Throughout the month of November, Re-Focus are running a number of 'taster sessions' where people can come along to find out more about the project and try out their skills in recycling. Alongside Lorraine Lewis, User Involvement Co-ordinator, a project worker and art student are on hand to support and teach new skills.

" We live in such a disposable society; many things are discarded that with just a little time and creativity can be turned into something that once again has value. Michelle says: 'When fellow cyclist Sue Meyer and I first suggested the idea, we thought we'd be struggling to find willing participants. But quite the opposite - we were inundated with volunteers! We hope what we have produced is something which is not only humorous and for a good cause, but gives people something in return for their donation to Hospice.'

If you don't, give them to La Mare Wine Estate....

It's all go at La Mare Wine Estate. They've moved one step further to concluding their extensive site redevelopment, with the installation of expensive new equipment apple-crushing (much better than the one below) The machine has been specially flown in from Germany and is able to process over a hundred tonnes of fruit before the end of the summer.

La Mare Wine Estate wants to help those people who see their precious fruit go to waste every year. The state-of-the-art crusher means La Mare are happy to purchase any surplus apples from Jersey orchards which would otherwise lie at the foot of the tree. The orchards at the La Mare Estate are now being picked and more apples are needed to make the most of the new equipment. It is hoped the new crusher will process over 100 hundred tonnes of apples before the end of the season.

La Mare Wine Estate can collect the apples, and even hand-pick them from the trees. The fresh juice will then be turned into quality products including Jersey Apple Brandy, traditional cider and Black Butter. Any variety of apples are usable but cider apples are preferred and if they are collected after windfall, fallen naturally from the tree, they yield more juice and produce a finer product.





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I want to be like you-hoo-hoo.

Poor Matthew Hiasl Pan. Unable to speak for himself and having been resident in an Austrian shelter for the last twenty-five years, Matthew's carers were worried about what would happen to him when the shelter closed as it ran out of funds. After a public appeal, people were happy to donate funds to ensure that he could be looked after somewhere else, but unfortunately Matthew was unable to open a bank account as under Austrian law, he can't receive personal gifts.

n April, a Austrian judge rejected a British woman's petition to be declared Matthew's legal guardian on the grounds that he was neither mentally impaired nor in danger, the grounds required for an individual to be appointed a guardian. In September, an attempt to appeal that decision failed as the persons who brought the action didn't have the legal standing to appeal on his behalf. "There is legal precedence in Austria for close friends to represent people who have no immediate family, so he should be represented by his closest friends, as is the case," said Eberhart Theuer, the legal adviser to the Vienna-based Association Against Animal Factories. Wait, what was that? Animal Factories?

That's right - Matthew is a chimpanzee. One of those big, hairy shuffling creatures that perform entertainingly obscene acts whenever you take your relatives to Durell. I remember all too well the time my beloved granny stared in astonishment as a hefty male swung his way to the top of the enclosure and released a steaming jet of p*ss onto the head of one of his cellmates. The latter, feeling the pitter-patter of golden raindrops on his ginger-tinged barnet, simply tilted his head so that the spray landed in his mouth, and proceeded to savour the pre-digested liquid as one would a nicely-decanted claret.

At £3,500 per month, these creatures certainly aren't cheap as chimps that's practically the salary of a States member (and significantly more than Gallery writers earn) although it's arguable that the chimp provides more in the way of practical and entertainment value than either. On the other hand, it's hard to think of many jobs that an ape could hold down in Jersey (leaving aside the obvious gags for a moment), but is there really that much of a difference between a chimp sitting about all day eating, defecating, sh*gging and watching Jeremy Kyle and what goes on in certain States flats and student halls of residence? So who is more deserving of the cash? At the moment, it's the lawyers (of course) - the case is going to Austria's Supreme Court for the final appeal.

Jersey trust surfs a green wave

The Bukit Lawang Charitable Trust has been nominated for a "Green Wave Award" by the Surfer's Path Magazine. In the category of non-profit making companies the Bukit Lawang Trust was nominated for excellence in achievement in promoting sustainability and environmental consciousness in the surfing world. Other organisations in this category include LEAP, Surfers against Sewage and the Eden Project.

The Bukit Lawang Trust was set up in 2003 in response to the flood that wiped out the village of Bukit Lawang, North Sumatra, Indonesia, to help to rehabilitate the community. After the tsunami in 2004, the Trust expanded and provided emergency aid, and continues to work throughout the region. The Trust has established a health clinic in Bukit Lawang and has brought educational materials to schools and to the remote villages on the island of Nias, West Sumatra. This year a team of volunteers from Jersey went to Sumtra to build a health centre to replace the temporary site. With funding from Jersey Overseas Aid this was successfully completed and is going to open next month.







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ynicism was invented in the 70's. An unjust war, corrupt government officials, faceless self serving multinationals, and a duplicitous right wing loony in the

White House. The parallels with today are obvious, which may explain the current trend of films set in said decade. The latest of these is Ridley Scott's crime epic, American Gangster.

The film tells the true life story of Frank Lucas (Denzil Washington), one time driver for notorious Harlem gangster Bumpy Johnson, who became kingpin of an enormous drug smuggling empire. Innovator of the so called, "cadaver connection". Lucas procures his heroin straight from the Golden Triangle in south east Asia and brings it in hidden in the coffins of GI's killed in Nam.

This corpsetastic work of macabre genius allows Lucas to rise above even the mafia in the drugs trade in New York. As you would expect this soon attracts the attention of the NYPD and in particular Det. Richie Roberts (Russell

Crowe) who becomes obsessed with bringing Lucas to justice.

American Gangster boasts an excellent performance from the seemingly ageless Washington (who must be at least 110 years old by now). Washington captures the paradoxical nature of the charismatic Lucas who is equally comfortable pouring petrol on his rivals and setting them alight as he is saying grace at Thanksgiving. However Lucas is not another psychotic gangster in the Joe Pesci mould and slowly it becomes apparent that his ethical code of honesty, integrity and hard work are not dissimilar values to the cop trying to bring him down.

With the hullabaloo surrounding Crowe's private life it's easy to forget that the boy can really act when the mood takes him and here he delivers a multi layered characterisation of Lucas' nemesis, the Serpicoesque Det. Roberts. A man who's battling to prove to his racist senior officers that it's a black man and not the mafia that controls the drugs trade in New York.

American Gangster is an engaging film which tackles the moral ambiguities of the American dream it never succumbs to the simple good guy versus bad guy scenario. Instead the film plays out more as a cautionary tale on the difficulties of engaging in a crusade when the people by your side are every bit as rotten as the ones you are trying to destroy.

Elizabeth: The Golden Age

t's been a year of sequels so far in Hollywood ranging from the good (Bourne Ultimatum, the annoying (Rush Hour 3) and the tedious (Pirates of the Caribbean 3). The most improbable is surely Elizabeth: The Golden Age, the follow up to 1998's Elizabeth. For whatever reason costume dramas never seem to warrant a second chapter perhaps due to the enormous chunk of the budget that ruffs, corsets, codpieces, etc swallow up.

That said the lovely Cate Blanchett has returned to reprise her Oscar nominated role as England's greatest monarch as does Geoffrey Rush playing the Machiavellian Sir Francis Walsingham.

The Golden Age sees Elizabeth beset by problems abroad as religious upheaval in Europe sees the Catholic King Philip of Spain vowing to restore England to the true faith. At home things are just as dangerous as Walsingham uncovers a plot by Elizabeth's cousin Mary Stuart to oust her from the throne. Whilst combating these two formidable enemies Queen Liz still has time to complicate things further by falling in love with the salty but dashing Sir Walter Raleigh (Clive Owen).

Panned by the critics Stateside, Elizabeth the Golden Age is historical film making for the Hollyoaks generation. What could have been a tale of high drama veers into high campery with director Shekhar Kapur paying more attention to the unrequited love story between Raleigh and Liz than any of the film's more weighty issues. By contrast the small matter of the defeat of the mighty Spanish Armada feels like it's been is tacked on at the end as an afterthought. The first film drew criticism for being over directed and it's the same story here with some of Kapur's camerawork looking like it's being performed by men on bungee ropes. Blanchett, eyebrowless and sporting some truly astonishing wigs is as watchable as ever and so too is Owen resplendent in gigantic pantaloons but like the Armada itself this one is an impressive looking disaster.





Well! 'Tummy-tuck', 'apronectomy' or abdominoplasty. There are many refinements of all these procedures, relating to scar placement, the use of liposuction, and simultaneous thigh lift, or breast contour surgery. These combination procedures are becoming increasingly popular.

Who are the best candidates for this surgery?

Women post childbirth form the most frequent group requesting tummy tucks to remove stretch marks. Another significant group in my practice is those people who have undergone severe weight loss, and need body contour surgery. Not all tummy tucks surgery is for cosmetic reasons. Many patients have significant problems finding clothing, or regaining exercise. After surgery, their ability and confidence return, and often their general health and fitness improve significantly. How long does it take to recover?

Patients are in hospital for two nights – operatively, during which time the nurses start gentle mobilisation. It's six weeks before you can drive or start sport again. We warn everyone that there is a time investment before getting back to normal life.

Tides at the Somerville Hotel

just love my job. Hard not to really – I get paid for eating out. In fact the only time I rather resent my occupation is when I'm in the gym trying to work off the pot belly all this fine dining has left me with. Sometimes though, my job is hard. Sometimes I have to do things that will really upset people. Yes, I'm talking to you, residents of St Aubin's. You just can't keep Tides to yourselves any more. It's time to share.

You've probably seen the Somerville Hotel. You can't really miss it, sitting chateau-proud above St Aubin's Harbour. It's had a bit of a makeover recently, and in Tides, the hotel's two AA rosette restaurant, everything's newly neutral-toned, with warm wood tables, crisp linen and modern glassware. The curtains are in the sort of glamorous huge print everyone's been going for, and the effect is soignée, chic and rather boutique hotel. Until you get to the carpet. Somehow the revamp hasn't yet reached the floor and it's still a swirly mass of red and purples circa 1982. I'm sure I remember my grandma having something similar in her living room. Maybe that's why so many of our fellow diners seemed to be twice our age. But I think these over-60's are on to something.

For a start there's the view, a full 180 degrees of the bay. Postcard perfect in the sunshine, full of twinkling lights after dark. And forget the usual St Aubin's parking space rage – with its own car park, you can wear your highest heels to the Somerville without worrying about having to walk miles. Then there's the impeccable service. Roberto our friendly maître d' was ready with recommendations but never pushy, and Nick the sommelier was knowledgeable and confident. With an extensive good value wine list, it wasn't too much of a challenge to find us a couple of good by-the-glass options. The Stop Banks Sauvignon was lovely – intense and crisp, and incredibly fruity. Don't let the description of powerful passion fruit flavours' put you off, it's a find at only £4.10 a glass.

Nothing in Tides in fact, appears to be extortionately priced – the à la carte menu has starters ranging from £6.50 to £8.50, with main courses generally under £20. The set menu is even more wallet-friendly with two courses for £20 and three courses for £25. And even after the Tennerfest finishes, the Tides lunch menu stays at £12.50 for three courses all year round.

Head chef Wayne Pegler cut his culinary teeth working with Hell's Kitchen chef Marco Pierre White in Canteen - and it shows in the robust flavours, adventurous combinations, and attention to detail. Wayne personally





checks every single dish before it leaves his kitchen to ensure it's faultless. Impressive stuff, especially considering his new baby daughter Charlotte had arrived just a few days before.

Everything sounded so delicious; we couldn't wait to see what it actually tasted like. Antonia had the shellfish soup with fresh lime leaves, smashed lemongrass and plenty of chilli. It was spicy - hot and sour with a fabulous aroma. 'Divine' pronounced Antonia, and it was, with the sort of clearly defined flavours only a freshly-made soup has. My soft-poached duck egg with ceps, leeks, asparagus and toasted brioche was as close to Eggs Benedict heaven as you could get. The salty, mushroomy ceps were the perfect accompaniment for soft, melting egg with buttery béarnaise sauce. And don't miss out on dunking the chargrilled asparagus tips. Delicious.

In between courses, a fresh lemon yoghurt sorbet, and then onto the main course. I'd been intrigued by the steak with tempura scallops and gambas in a Thai coconut sauce. Surf and turf Koh Samui-style? Sounds like something you'd order when you're three sheets to the wind in some backstreet Bangkok bar. And it should be horrible. But it isn't. Somehow the flavours come together deliciously with flawlessly done tempura seafood. I even had a perfect medium steak, exactly as I'd asked for. 



"It's really quite meaty and so many people undercook it – but this is done perfectly". The shallot tarte tatin was "deliciously caramelised", the celeriac purée was "deep and brooding" and the osso bucco was "melt in the mouth". All this talking with her mouth full - I think she fancies herself as the new Nigella.

Desserts were similarly impressive, an incredible tepee-style nougat parfait for me, with gorgeous poached pear slices covered with a toffee-apple sugar crust and fresh blueberries. Antonia had the cheese board – a generous selection of five different cheeses served at a perfect temperature with plenty of biscuits and homemade fruit chutney.

Top marks to Tides - the food was generous, imaginative and realistically priced; the service was impeccable and the location – well it's just stunning. There was really nothing to fault. Except perhaps the carpet.





La Robeline

Jersey enthusiast, Richard Matlock, had always wanted to make cider. He took himself off to Normandy, to the heart of cider country, and learned from the experts. He came back to Jersey with a vintage press, which he restored and now makes 10,000 litres of cider a year. We're talking proper cider here, cidre bouchée, that is fermented in the bottle, like champagne, and fixed with a cork. A highly skilled process that starts with selecting and blending the sweetest, juiciest apples (Richard planted 450 appellation controlée trees in St Ouen) and carefully controlling the fermenting process. The result is a delicious Dry or Medium cider, made from only 100% apple juice, with a pleasing sparkle and a round apple flavour. Available in farm shops, Relish and selected off licences.



Cauldron bubble

Take 12 gallons of cider, boil and reduce by one third, add half a ton of sweet apples and 100lbs of sour apples and cook and reduce for a good 12 hours, add 24lbs sugar, liquorice and 10 lemons and cook for another 12 hours, stirring continuously over an open fire. Remove from the heat and add 8oz mixed spice and 8oz cinnamon. Cool and bottle. This thickening potion of sweet, spicy Black Butter was made last weekend at The Elms in St Mary. Home to the National Trust and part of an annual tradition that involves apple peelers and strong armed stirrers working right through the night as the mixture caramalizes slowly over an open fire. The Black Butter is highly concentrated and a deep brown and is called butter only because of its consistency. Spread on fresh bread or hot buttered toast for a sweet distillation of Autumn. You can find jars at the Spice House in the Market or from La Mare Vineyards.

We talked about supporting local coffee shops with an emphasis on those that grind their own. We obviously couldn't include everyone so picked a few good ones. 



The Second World War, an abattoir, a gun emplacement and a can of Coke...Not your everyday considerations when designing a new building, but these were the challenges faced by architects Axis Mason when rehousing Jersey Tourism and the States tourism department. Words: Donna White

The first building to open on the £30 million development of the old abattoir site, is set to be part of a Covent Gardenstyle experience, surrounded by cafes, restaurants and boutique-type shops.But while this is a new era for the site, retaining its history was important to islanders. At one end, a commemorative plaque marks where non-Jersey born residents were lined up to be shipped to concentration camps during the Second World War. And embedded in the old granite wall where

the Tourism building now stands is a gun emplacement – another reminder of the German occupation.

Preserving history to sit alongside the new building was of paramount importance to Axis Mason, which made sure the granite wall was carefully dismantled, numbered and rebuilt along with the gun emplacement. The curve of this end of the site dictated the shape of the new Jersey Tourism building – nicknamed the Coke can by locals.

Axis Mason interior designer Siobhan Macleod explained: "The philosophy behind the development was to show the contrast between the historical and the new. The glass elevation sitting behind the granite creates an impressive overall effect."

The interior comprises 10,000 sq ft of open plan working space over four floors, together with a top-floor media and conference suite. The décor follows a sea


and sand theme, with plasma screens carefully placed to give up-to-date reports from the airport and harbours.

The decoration fully reflects the recently launched Jersey brand, whilst the exterior colour of the building sits perfectly amongst its maritime surroundings. Project managers and cost consultants Rowney Sharman were given the task of

- •Asset anything owned by an individual or a business that has commercial or exchange value.
- •AUDIT inspection of the accounting records and procedures of a business, government unit, or other reporting entity by a trained accountant for the purpose of verifying the accuracy and completeness of the records.
- •BIG FOUR usually refers to the largest accounting firms: Deloitte, Ernst & Young, KPMG and PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC).
- •Break-even analysis an analysis method used to determine the number of jobs or products that need to be sold to reach a break-even point in a business.
- •CORPORATE FINANCE helping client companies to raise money (eg by issuing shares) in order to expand and develop.
- •CREDIT SCORE an assessment made by a lender to evaluate the level of risk you pose as a borrower.
- •Depreciation the decreasing value of an asset, for example a house or car, over a period of time.
- •DIVIDEND money paid out to shareholders relative to the company's profits over a period of time, usually on an annual or six monthly basis.
- Equity the value of a property minus any money owed on it.
- •EQUITY RELEASE when a new or larger mortgage is taken out to free some of the equity that has built up in your



fitness: ski training

Main Workout for ski training



With November already here and our summer holidays a distant memory, a lot of us will be thinking towards our next one, which for many will be a skiing trip. Having worked in the mountains before and having seen how they affect untrained legs, I can't emphasize enough how you will gain so much more from the experience if

you begin to put in some effort now. Many of my clients ski, and will tell you that their stamina and endurance was much improved by doing some decent preparation, so lets look at a bit of their training regime. (Leg Strength and Core Stability)

(Remember Higher reps are better for endurance)





1. The Bosu Plank Lunge

Start off by holding the sides of the bosu ball at arms length in a press-up position. Then slowly step with one leg at a time towards your hand on the same side. Be sure to maintain a solid bridge position with your body. You will really feel this work your lower abdominals.

2. Plyometric Box

With the box you want to stand in the middle, then first jump out forwards, back in backwards, then to the side and back in, repeating as you go round all four sides in a clockwise motion. Remember try and keep the jumps high and as accurate as possible landing softly to protect the knee joints.

Single Leg Squats

Place the Swiss ball behind you, and hold some weights if necessary, then with your front leg doing all the work lower yourself down until the back knee almost touches the floor. This takes quite a bit a balance to do it right, so I suggest looking straight ahead as this will help. Then slowly push back up again and repeat.

4. The Wall Sit

Everybody's favourite! It may cause discomfort, but I can tell you, time put in on this test, will help increase your stamina no end. Simply sit with your thighs at right angles to the wall and over the weeks try and improve the length of time you can hold the position.

test drive



don't know about you but with all that we hear about being friendlier to the environment and our carbon footprint I realise I am, and you may be too, developing a bit of a guilt complex about what natural resources I consume. On my passport, for occupation I wanted to put "consumer", but I thought American customs might not see the joke and knowing what their sense of humour is like I decided not to risk it.

Now really what I should do is maybe cycle or walk more, and cut out unnecessary trips in the car, or even get an economical car — a dual fuel hybrid perhaps. Mine isn't at all economical, but I love it so I'm keeping it, which is a perfect example of hypocrisy in action, and probably the source of the guilt.

But I can do the next best thing, and that is to encourage other people to be more environmentally friendly, drive economical cars, and cycle more. Saying that though, am I alone in saying that I am also getting sick of having to drive behind incourteous yellow jersey and lycra shorts wearing Tour de France hopefuls who will not ride on the left or allow traffic to pass? Perhaps it would be better if you walked more.

Or, whilst talking of France, consider Aixam Multirucks, located in the French Alps, manufacturers of small, incredibly efficient and environmentally friendly utility vehicles.

In many ways typically French, Multitrucks are quite single mindedly practical and made for a purpose. They are small, just 3 metres long and 1.5 wide, and are available as vans, flat beds, tippers or custom builds. If you wanted a circus cannon on the back they could probably do it. Multitrucks are built like tiny lorries, they start with a cab and engine on a chassis and then the choice of load space is up to you. The build is also functional and practical with an aluminium chassis and scratch resistant composite polyester and ABS acrylic body panels. They are extraordinarily durable, versatile and are intended to be the pinnacle of function and efficiency, tailored as closely as possible to your needs. Utilitarian, that's the word I was looking for.

Power options are either a small highly efficient Kubota diesel engine or General electrics electric motors. With either power unit they are slow, the maximum speed for the diesel is about 50mph,

and the electric 30mph. The option of fully electric powered I found intriguing though. The maximum payload is lower; 335KG as opposed to 44KG for the diesel and fully loaded the maximum incline for either version is 13%, so that would be a consideration. (consideration being to work out how steep 13% is probably). But because they are so focused on their uses, in the right environment, say for parks, or towns they are ideal. Range on a single charge for the electric version is 40 – 60 miles and a full recharge, from a standard socket takes 7 to 9 hours and costs pennies.

The driving experience is also fairly utilitarian, the ride is firm, the cabs are basic though ergonomically pleasing. The electric version is obviously very quiet but the diesel is noisy and sounds like a lawn mower, though it does give 60+ mpg. The overall impression is agricultural, but again it's all about practicalities. They are not built to be luxurious.

Now that's the good news... the bad news is - you can't have one



Now that's the good news, the bad news is that you can't have one, in Jersey at least. Whilst they are built to conform to European type approval, and can be driven in almost every country in Europe, they fall into the "quad" vehicle type and are licensed as such. Unfortunately Jersey does not have an equivalent vehicle category - which is why you don't see many quads around, (though the golf course down the road from me has one) and unless that changes Multitrucks or any other similar vehicles won't be allowed on our roads. It's for all our benefit to have such stringent safety regulations, but when things need to change, well, things need to change.

If I was the Parish of St Helier, and was looking for vehicles to use for parks services, or electric vehicles for quiet operation in town, or if I wanted a mascot vehicle for my fleet to show that I was a conscientious business concerned about the environment -I'd probably start writing letters about this. Laws do change and if we're going to actually do something about the environment and change our ways, maybe the legislature, and I, might have to join in too.

And I promise, my next car will be a hybrid.





Winter Warmers

For years I've been seeing scooters and motorbikes in France adorned with winter covers and wondering how long before we'd see them here. Now they are, so the practicality and economy of biking to work can continue through the winter without worrying so much about the weather.



This month we tested a scooter with leg protectors and handlebar covers, and what a difference it makes.

It's getting pretty cold in the mornings now, and you'd be starting to feel the chill on your bike. Normally I'd be thinking about begrudgingly taking the car some days, but these covers make a huge difference. The leg covers attach easily to the front of your bike and wrap around to cover you from the waste down. They are waterproof, windproof and thermally insulated so wet or dry you are warmer, and if it rains, you're warm and dry. They are very comfortable and don't hinder riding the bike in any way and when parked they cover the seat too.

The other piece of the puzzle is handgrip covers. These slip over the hand grips and again are thermally insulated so you just slide in your hands – it feels odd at first but after about 5 seconds you wondered how you ever managed without them. It will probably cost you around a hundred pounds to kit your scooter out, but well worth it. The overall feeling of warmth and comfort is terrific, because you actually feel safer from being covered and not shivering you can enjoy the ride to work all year round.

Described as taking Emin's work "quite literally out of the gallery and on to the street", the cars have created the first moving exhibition of its kind. The three other 500s with Emin designs will also be offered at auction, one before the end of the year and two in 2008, so you can still get one if you really really want to.

The Audi R8: The slowest car Audi have ever built.

To build, that is. Audi UK is investing more than £6 million to support its R8 high-performance sports car with one of the most ironic claims in the history of advertising: "the slowest car we've ever built". The new campaign featuring the sought-after all-aluminium, quattro four-wheel-driven, V8-powered two-seater breaks this week, and represents the largest investment ever made by Audi UK in the launch of a new car.

The R8 is, of course, anything but slow off the mark: it is the fastest production car Audi has ever produced, but because each one is constructed with painstaking precision, largely by hand, it actually has the slowest build process of all Audi models. Only 450 cars will be delivered in the UK this year, and 750 in 2008, with prices starting at £77,000.

"The R8 is the epitome of Vorsprung durch Technik – it embodies everything it stands for – advancement through technology," explains Peter Duffy, Audi UK's Head of Marketing. "It also symbolises progressive design, our pursuit

of perfection and unrivalled handling built from our motorsport history. We had to tell the story of how the car is built."

That story will be told in a go-second commercial developed by creative duo Richard McGrann and Andy Clough of Bartle Bogle Hegarty (BBH), Audi's long-standing creative partner and the agency responsible for encapsulating its values in the UK through the 'Vorsprung durch Technik' catchphrase. It uses a filming technique developed by director Olivier Gondry, and observes a group of real Audi mechanics over a number of days as they construct the vehicle from the very first bolt to the finished car.

"We wanted to make a film which made the process of constructing an R8 as beautiful as the car itself," explains Richard McGrann. The effect captures the workers' movement through time – each frame measures a point in time compressed into one shot. Filming took place over eight days in Germany, with each frame requiring a minimum of 20 different shots and four layers to achieve the unique visual effect.

The soundtrack for the commercial is provided by critically acclaimed folk singer Simone White, whose pure vocals and haunting melodies have had both critics and listeners spellbound. The beautiful track, 'The Beep Beep', is taken from Simone's new album – 'I am the Man'

UK call for 20 mph speed limits is fatally flawed

PACTS - The Parliamentary Advisory Council for Transport Safety are once again offering the Government misguided advice on road safety by calling for a default speed limit of 20 mph in towns. Road safety isn't about 'simple' physics; it's about all road users behaving in a safe manner.

ABD – Association of British Drivers spokesman Nigel Humphries says, "Concentration, alertness, and observation are fundamental factors required for safe driving, which are maximised by the driver setting a speed appropriate for the prevailing road conditions. Forcing drivers to travel below an appropriate speed is therefore detrimental to road safety."

Vehicle stopping distances are determined initially by driver reaction time, and the Highway Code braking distances are not representative of modern car braking systems. Furthermore, a 20 mph speed limit will cause more congestion and increase vehicle emissions. Safe Speed has already pointed out the fact that DfT figures for 2006 show that there were more killed or seriously injured casualties in 20 mph zones than in 30 mph zones.
