Favourite book? Any of the Shopaholic books Do I have to? Mazda Demio Car you drive?






3) I've heard on the grapevine you've won before.. what did you win!?


We have indeed won a few times – 5 to

5) And your worst?



6) What can people expect who've signed up?



Balloonatic

Bored this winter? So was Kent Couch. In a bid to outdo rival Sir Richard Branson, the 47 year old petrol station owner filled 105 balloons with helium, attached them to his favourite garden chair, then sat back and drifted away.

His bizarre adventure took him from Oregon in the US, to the neighbouring state of Idaho. About nine hours later, he came back to earth in a farmer's field, a little way from home (about 193 miles to be precise). Thats roughly the distance from Jersey to London and a much cheaper option than flying. Don't all rush out to Ransom's just yet though, we wouldn't recommend re-creating his balloon adventure at home. In a previous attempt in September, Mr Couch got off the ground for six hours using a pellet gun to pop the balloons, but he went into a rapid descent and eventually had to parachute to safety.

Male topi antelope's sex burden

Choosy males and aggressive females - a role reversal has been found in the sexual behaviour of the topi antelope. Some males are so forcefully pursued by pushy females that they refuse the advances of previous partners.

According to research published in the journal Current Biology, this helps males conserve their sperm for the possibility of mating with new females. It therefore increases the chances of fatherhood with the widest possible number of partners.

Dr Jakob Bro-Jorgensen, the scientist conducting the Zoological Society of London (ZSL) research, said: "In cases where the male antelope was free to choose between females, he deliberately went for the most novel mate, rather than the most high-ranking."

He added: "However, some pushy females were so aggressive in their pursuit of the male that he actually had physically to attack them to rebuff their advances."

The research was undertaken in the Masai Mara area of Kenya, in the traditional breeding grounds of the topi.

Copious copulations

Females are fertile for a single day only. The topi antelope (Damaliscus lunatus jimela) come together once a year, for just over a month to mate.

Dr Bro-Jorgensen said: "It is not uncommon to see males collapsing with exhaustion as the demands of the females get too much for them."

He observed that each female would mate, on average, with four males, while some reached 12 different partners. And each individual would be mated with approximately 11 times, although one pair was observed together on 36 occasions.

Unexpected behaviour

These findings are contrary conventional sexual selection theory which says males are competitive and females are choosy. Talking to the BBC News website, Dr Bro-Jorgensen said: "We may not have our eyes open to the fact that opposite sexual conflicts may occur more commonly than we think. Normally, males are persistent and females resistant. What I saw in African topi was unexpected."

The synchronised mating activity, and the species' promiscuity, makes males the limited resource and females the competitive ones.

It is thought the females are interested in mating with several partners to ensure fertilisation, in case their first choice happens to have reduced sperm supply, or is genetically incompatible with them.

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Getting Cross



On the whole, I approve of property rights. The whole communism movement has never really floated my boat – partly because I like to see some connection between my labour and my (entirely reasonable) salary, but also because I am unable to think of a single car or building (or boat for that matter) built by socialists which has had an ounce of aesthetic merit. I can appreciate that pure utilitarian design can have a certain beauty, but a system which incarcerates novelists, artists and thinkers for their political views is always going to struggle to get the best out of people.

Of course, in an ideal communist state, everybody would be provided for according to their needs (which is fine so long as they realise that my needs extend to a wine cellar, racing yacht and car collection), and so there would be no need for charities. Clearly, this would be catastrophic in Jersey as it would result in a legion of ladies of a certain age who had hitherto kept themselves entertained with charitable activities having absolutely nothing to do - causing a predictably devastating effect on the alcoholism, domestic violence and divorce statistics. In fact, the whole fabric of society would quickly crumble into a morass of drinking, fighting and fornicating (thus fulfilling the JEP's dearest wish as all its complaints about behaviour in town on a Friday night finally become reality).

As it is, charitable causes get a particularly warm reception over here as wallets laden with cash and guilt are lightened in equal measure by teams of fundraisers desperate to do the right thing. However, in my view the problems start when charities become businesses and start paying out thousands or even millions of pounds on advertising and wages – funds which frankly would be better spent elsewhere. Fortunately there are websites out there (such as http:// www.charitynavigator.org) which identify which charities spend the most and the least on administration thus enabling people to make sure that the money they donate actually does what they want it to.

Now, I'm not naïve to the extent that I expect multi-million pound projects to be managed entirely by volunteers and I'm perfectly happy to accept that a charity such as the NSPCC should pay money to corporate behemoths so as to ensure that people are aware of child abuse and the need to stop it, but is a minute-long advert setting out gruesome tales of abuse really helping anyone? I reckon that if someone is actively abusing children, they've probably reached a mental state where watching an advert on TV, no matter how harrowing, isn't going to make a jot of difference.

I know that this is probably the wrong message, but all I get from the process is that the NSPCC would like to let us know how horrible child abuse is, so we then donate money to them, so that they can pay for more adverts about how horrible child abuse is. to a man called Bubba who will make you realise how deeply unpleasant a romantic evening in can be.

So what do charities have to do with property rights, you might ask (if you haven't stopped bothering looking for joined-up discussion long ago)? Simple.The Red Cross in America is currently engaged in a dispute with Johnson & Johnson (a major US manufacturer of health supplies) over the use of the red cross symbol. You may think that as the Red Cross is called, well, the Red Cross, that they had the right to use the red cross symbol as they liked. In which case you'd be wrong. And you'd be severely overestimating the morals of American lawyers.

Although the organisations which popularised the red cross as a sign for medics in wartime predate our friends at Johnson x2, it was the latter who registered a trademark application for the symbol in 1887, a whole thirteen years before the American Red Cross received its charter from the US Congress. Apparently, the founder of the Red Cross had in 1895

entered into an agreement with J&J which gave it the exclusive use of the symbol for drug, chemical and surgical products.

This arrangement worked fine for a hundred years or so, but recently the Red Cross have started trying to licence the symbol to other companies to raise money – their funds having dried up in the last year due to, ironically, a lack of highprofile American disasters (apparently the sight of homeless millionaires after the Malibu fires provoked more schadenfreude than anything else). Jsquared have taken exception to this development and their lawyers are demanding that the Red Cross should hand over the profits it has made together with any unsold stocks. The whole thing sounds like a recipe for PR suicide (even considering that JJ have donated US\$5m to the Red Cross over the last three years), but it throws into relief the problems caused where intellectual property rights are claimed over an image or phrase that, to all intents and purposes, is already in the public domain.

You've probably heard of daft publicitycourting efforts like Posh Spice trying to copyright the word 'Posh' or Paris Hilton trying to copyright the phrase 'That's Hot' but imagine if someone were to try to claim the image of Mont Orgueil or Corbiere as their own property and stop others using it. Sounds mad? If I set up Corbiere Studios limited and had an image of the lighthouse as my logo at the start of every film, what's to stop me claiming that the use of that image in connection with films as a trademark? People would associate the image with my business and so surely I should be able

to protect it from exploitation? It's this balancing act of public and private interests that keeps us lawyers thinking - and for every hour we spend thinking, someone ends getting the bill...





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There are many film directors who long to achieve the success of the 1999 film cult classic 'The Blair Witch Project' and according to the hype 'Cloverfield' may do exactly that. Words: Kate Sloan

The poster for it features a decapitated statue of liberty - enticing enough for action film junkies like myself. Adding to the hype it also has a large blockbuster budget and is produced by J.J Abrams (creator of 'Lost') who has also directed 'Mission Impossible 3' and will be directing the up and coming eleventh Star Trek movie (very exciting!) so you know there will be some nice Hollywood violence thrown in.

It a story of five young New Yorkers who throw their friend, Rob (played by Michael Stahl-David), a going away party and decide to document it the same night a giant monster invades the city. The ode to Blair Witch comes from the fact that nearly all the story is told from the point of view of their camera. Now I know that sounds like quite a nauseous point of view but if you have seen the trailer you will see that this has the potential to make for quite interesting viewing as unlike Blair Witch there is a lot more going on then people running into trees. Just from watching a two minute extract, you are already getting drawn in, leaning over to try and see what the hell just brought down a sixty-storey skyscraper but clever amateur angles that let you see just enough to keep you in suspense. There is a love story at the centre of this film as there always is between Rob and Beth (played by Ordette Yustman) although a third of the way in it gets forgotten due to the mass of screaming and explosions happening in the centre of New York, depicting the mass hysteria of 9/11.

In between the main story are quick fifteen-minute scenes from footage between Beth and Rob on Coney Island giving the viewer some background information on the main characters, which adds some focus to the story..

I find you can't beat a good scary action thriller with lots of noise and dramatic action. I know it's only February so it's early to say this but so far this is set to be top of the chart in this category in 2008.



'Sweeney Todd', the latest big-screen musical adaptation from director Tim Burton starring his favourite actor, Johnny Depp is set to be a delightfully dark and gothic story of the 'The Demon Barber of Fleet Street'.

The evil genius Tim Burton, accompanied by musical director Stephen Sondheim, delivers the nightmarish story of a wrongfully judged barber who comes back to set up shop in London cutting the hair and throats of his 'customers' while his partner-in-crime Mrs Lovett (played by Helana Bonham Carter) disposes of the bodies by making them into pies.

As this is based on the musical, singing is to be expected from the famous Johnny Depp providing an almost rock and roll quality to his character with his harsh, thin voice. The musical musings of this film could be heralded as some of the finest in the last 40 years making the bloody story even more enjoyably dark to watch. Victoria's at the Grand Prasserie Chic

Don't you just love going out for a good old gossip? Especially with someone as famously indiscreet as my friend Veronica. Dear old Ronnie only needs a couple of glasses of Dom, and she'll tell you what everyone's been up to, who with, and how often.

Ronnie and I had dodged the drizzle to catch the Friday night DJ set at the Champagne Bar, and she was full of scandalous secrets about our fellow cocktail-drinkers. She'd just finished telling me about the restauranteur who'd dropped a lighted match into his lap at a party the previous week and set his trousers on fire. 'I was right beside him and tried to put it out with the contents of my glass. Shame it was a double brandy - he got rather flambé-ed'. Unfortunately the 'laid-back Latino funk' didn't quite drown out Ronnie's voice and we escaped the glares from the next table and moved into the calmer environment of Victoria's.

It's been a year since Victoria's had its legendary revamp, turning it from classic hotel dining room into something closer to contemporary casino chic. The décor echoes the warm wine colours of the hotel think a ruby-red Beaujolais Nouveau, with chiffon burgundy drapes and velvet banquettes. It certainly ticks all the boxes for anyone looking for a luxurious take on a hotel dining room. And if you've never experienced the Supper Club on Saturday evenings, you've missed out – there's a swing band playing Sinatra classics while you dine. Catch the next Supper Clubs on the 16th and 23rd February.

The famous chef Albert Roux is a consultant for all the menus at the Grand – from room service to fine dining - and he certainly brings a dash of Francophone chic to the menu at Victoria's, reinventing brasserie classics with a Jersey twist. With breakfast, lunch and dinner available, head chef Adrian Doolan can whip up anything from French-style salads and vegetarian pastas to steaks and fish dishes, all presented in a fresh, uncomplicated way. There's even a rather chic little children's menu (2 courses £6.50, 3 courses £8.50) with fabulous kiddie food like melon sorbet, chicken curry, steak and profiteroles for your budding gastronomes.

Veronica started with the garlic

king prawn Caesar salad from the set dinner menu (£25.95 for 3 courses). It was light and tasty, with fresh anchovies but the prawns arrived unpeeled and topping and tailing them was a bit too much for Ronnie's new manicure. Still she did get a finger bowl. My smoked salmon with blinis and horseradish was slightly disappointing, with the blinis looking like they'd been made the day before, and then refried to heat them up. More bleugh than blini – but the smoked salmon was delicious, and was served with heaps of salad.

The service was excellent - our Polish waitress really was charming, helpful but never intrusive. recommended a classic Sancerre (Le Manoir Andre Neveu 2005, £27.50), which turned out to be a very good choice – on the affordable side of the wine list but crisp and fruity enough to stand out.

Ronnie had the baked artichoke with a ratatouille-esque arrangement of Mediterranean vegetables and a rice pilaff. At first sight the dish looked a bit odd - the baked artichoke heart was rather grey, but that could have just been the lighting because it tasted delicious. My fish, mussel, cider and leek pie was yummy, just like Nanny used to make. Creamy, salty and filling, it's the perfect solution to post-Champagne Bar munchies when the canapé menu just isn't enough.

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As for the desserts, well you're going to have to forget your diet I'm afraid – they're all comfort food favourites. From dark chocolate crème brulée to sticky toffee pudding and even a cheese trolley – it's worth saving space. I tried an cinnamon-heavy apple crumble with vanilla sauce and ice-cream that I loved but Veronica thought was a bit too rich. But don't trust her opinion, I wonder she can taste anything after her diet of champagne cocktails. We also went for a caramelized lemon tart that had come straight from the imagination of Albert Roux – or so the menu said. It was an interesting hybid of tarte au citron and crème brulée – very French patisserie.


So don't forget about Victoria's. Tasilli's great of course for a special occasion, but Victoria's a failsafe option. It's one of those places that could find you a table for a group of garrulous girls as well as an intimate corner for a romantic dinner. And you can always retire to the Champagne Bar for post-prandial drinks. Which is of course what Ronnie and I did. Until it was time to go home, and ignoring an over-friendly financier's offer of a lift, we jumped into a cab. Her botox might have slipped, but it's good to know Veronica still has her standards.





Frozen fish fingers

Spare a thought for our chilly fishermen, battling the wintry high seas, to bring us lovely fresh fish. February is miserable for fisherman but good for fish and local catches this month include brill, skate, whiting, turbot, sole, crab and lobster.

Purple Highness

Purple sprouting broccoli, this god of green veg, is now in season. It has a much finer taste than year-round calebrese broccoli and makes the perfect partner to almost any fish or meat dish.

Look for darkly coloured specimens with crisp stalks, no bigger than 1cm in diameter, which snap cleanly when broken. (Always avoid bendy broccoli.) Packed full of vitamins A and C, iron, calcium and fibre, it is as healthy as it is tasty. Lightly boil or steam until tender and top with a melting knob of yellow butter, a squeeze of lemon and a grind of black pepper. Farm shops and the Market are your best bet.





Chicken and Egg

Anyone who saw Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall's and Jamie Oliver's programmes highlighting the plight of the humble chicken, probably found themselves drawn, wide-eyed to the screen, with all the horror of watching a car crash. Intensively farmed birds make up to 95% of the chicken eaten in the UK. Sir Jamie introduced us to the Frankenstein bird - a cheaper than chips chicken that gains 6 og a day - which goes from chick to cling wrap in a staggering 38 days. An animal so top heavy and cramped that it can't stand and spends most of the day sitting in chicken shit. Contrast that with happy healthy birds, scratching around outside and taking up basket weaving. The message is buy the best you can afford and look for labels that say organic, free range or RSPCA Freedom Food.

Why is it that our food choices seems to get more and more difficult? What we eat and where we shop has never been more talked about - helped along by by the likes of Jamie, Hugh and Gordon and a large dollop of obesity.

Closer to home the debate has been simmering about a new supermarket chain coming to the Island. Global retail giant Tesco has been suggested. More stores would mean better competition and lower prices, we're told. The States appear to support this notion, so they asked people if they wanted cheaper food and more choice. As long as there are bears and woods we know the answer to this. These are important questions, but life, as we know, is more complicated. Money off our weekly staples sounds very appealing but where would this food come from and where would the profits go? Not here.

Let's look at the expansion of Farm Shops on the Island in the last 5 years, ranging from the side-of-the-road honesty boxes (long may they last) right up to those shops on farms that sell almost anything. These are Jersey farmers who have diversified, either by going organic, like Vermont Farm, creating delicious cheeses and milk, like Classic Farm or by growing into one-stop shops selling bread, meat, fish alongside fruit, vegetables, herbs and interesting grocery bits, like Holme Grown and Rondel's.

Richard Rondel has been running his farm shop in St John since April 05, and turned over an impressive £1m in the first full year of trading. Keen to build on his success and create something more, he visited farm shops in Daylesford in Gloucestershire and Chatsworth, on the Duke of Devonshire's estate, to see how their model could be brought to Jersey. It is a philosophy of sustainability, working with local growers, suppliers and smaller independent companies, here and in the UK, to create a friendly shopping experience.

Working in consultation with architect Saskia Lee and conservation expert, Aaron Le Couteur, Richard has a holistic vision to create a new site on the field in front of his farm. Saskia has drawn up plans of a light, organic structure made of timber, stone, slate, glass and granite. One that is human in scale rather than a slab of a shed or the lymeswold vernacular favoured by supermarket chains. She says, "I wanted to create a building that sits as peacefully in the environment as possible. Some elevations have been designed to be as transparent as possible, bringing down the barriers between 'inside and outside' ". Energy efficiency and using eco products in the build have also been important considerations. Aaron has recommended that nesting boxes for barn owls and house martins, orchards of native trees and a wild flower meadow be introduced to the new site to encourage wildlife.

Richard is committed to pursuing education facilities for children and adults through schemes such as school allotments in the surrounding fields, an exhibition and seminar space in the new building and cameras in the nesting boxes. Rondel's would be more than somewhere to pop in and buy supper, it would be a pleasing shopping environment that involved the community in the seasons and the countryside.

Last month, Jersey Chamber of Commerce commissioned Prof Sparks from the Institute of Retail Studies to analyse the viability of introducing a third supermarket. His recommendation was overwhelmingly against the proposal on all counts, adding that a major new operator, which may well develop a monopoly position (Tesco have 28% of the UK market), would end up diminishing choice for local consumers.

Rondel's new building hasn't yet received planning consent. Meanwhile the Waterfont is being cleared. Which way do we want to go in Jersey? We have local shops and markets that are the envy of towns and cities in the UK, desperate to reverse 8os and 9os retail policy that favoured out-of-town shopping. Do we want local businesses to grow and flourish, thereby increasing competition and sustainability, or do we want cheaper food whatever the cost? Do we want to push our trolleys down endless lonely supermarket aisles or chat to the butcher about his homemade sausages? The questions aren't straightforward but the answer is



Rojo, meaning red in Spanish, is the ultimate bar in terms of a romantic ambiance with a warm winter feeling. Anouska believes that each house or room has a feel, and from walking in and gauging the mood, this ultimately influences her designs.

Anouska recently rescued a residence from an ugly 1980's renovation (as pictured). The concept for the house was Modern Parisian Vintage She told me she wanted to 'put a very luxury but individual Parisian edge into the bedrooms and then more of a South of France mood in the garden and bathroom to work with the warmth and light.

'I wanted to bring out the personality of the house that had been stripped when it was modernized in the 1980's. I did this by using a very soft vintage palette of Farrow & Ball colours, by using slightly different tonal shades I managed to put back the three dimensional sense of space and brought out the character of the house. I think it's very important to work with the spatial, atmospheric and architectural elements of the property and to work with what you have rather than try to make it something it absolutely is not. Therefore each project is completely individual and unique but still with my style blueprint."

Through travelling to places including Morocco, Rome, Ibiza, Florence, and Paris,



she told me'l love the outdoor living and bright colours which are reflected in the french country kitchen and sub tropical garden of this refurbished house.'.

With inspirations including architecture, the Art Deco period, elements of modernism, extensive travel and designers such as David Collins and Anouska Hampel, Anouska understands the language of design, but more significantly understands the importance of the total design package. 'I am totally inspired by high-end living, and am obsessed with luxury hotels. Through my extensive travels I've journeyed to

many of the best hotels and this love of luxury from many different cultures is really reflected in my work, although I manage to achieve it on a substantially lower budget!"

This year Anouska is completing a large residential project in London, and hopes to move away from the fashion industry completely to concentrate on this type of work. With strong ties on the island, she is frequently here and I for one, am looking forward to seeing more of her interior work here in Jersey.



Make the Most of Work Experience

An increasing number of students are learning that relevant work experience can be invaluable to developing new skills, creating networking opportunities, enhancing their CV and may even lead to a full-time position upon graduation.

Having landed a work experience opportunity, how do you make the most of it? How do you ensure a successful experience? Here are a few tips to help you on your way:

Purpose: Set goals you want to accomplish. Is it learning a particular accounting or marketing skill, learning a new software application, improving your customer service skills, or building your network?

Keep a positive attitude at all

times: This will demonstrate your ability to go the extra mile and your commitment to the work at hand.

Ask questions! Work experience is a learning opportunity. The employer does not expect you to know everything. Always seek advice and raise questions whenever you encounter something unfamiliar.

Take initiative: Don't be afraid to contribute your ideas; thinking outside the box is a much sought after attribute – just be make sure you listen carefully.

Keep notes: A journal/diary of your achievements and skills learned. Use this to build up your CV and provide evidence of your performance.

Thinking about borrowing?

Make sure you get the most out of your finances.

Credit is on the up with UK consumers borrowing an extra £318 million – that's the latest report from finance facts website Moneybasics UK.

At Equipment Rental Finance, (EQR) we understand how easy it is to lose track of your finances, especially if you have several credit cards and loans with different lenders. The temptation to sign up to the glossy credit card offers that land on your doormat each week, offering you zero balance transfers and interest-free credit is often too difficult to resist.

Research before you decide to commit to any borrowing

Credit card companies often emphasise how easy it is to apply for credit cards, but it's worth doing a little research before you commit. 





This is easy – you can't have missed the ad campaign for the new Fiat 500, there's been stuff everywhere, plus an amazing interactive community website and a massive launch event at the London Eye. I'm wondering at the time of writing how they got it in there?! Fiat have really done a great job this time.

It used to be that Fiats were, well Fiats. They had their place and I've always liked them as they had character, but build quality and styling did sometimes let them down. The quality has improved over the years but the last couple of years in particular have seen a dramatic change, and this is the clever bit, Fiat have decided to get the style back, and they've done it really well.

Thinking about it, they were sitting on a great opportunity waiting to happen. Small cars have been boring for a long time. Only the new Mini has made any serious attempt in the style department and you could say that it's based more on retro style generally than much of it's own heritage. The new 500 really maintains the character of the original.

There are several engine options for the 500; 1.2 litre to 1.4, and 3 main levels of trim "Pop", "Lounge" and "Sport".

Pop is the entry level though still very well kitted out with power steering, remote central locking, electric windows and door mirrors, ABS, seven airbags, height adjustable driver's seat and steering wheel and CD Radio with MP3 connectivity.

Lounge is the comfy version, with a soft, more opulent interior, leather steering wheel with built in audio controls, air conditioning, something called "Blue and Me" - Microsoft Bluetooth connectivity, voice recognition (which is great!) steering wheel audio controls and digital audio connectivity, 15 inch alloy wheels, and fancier trim.

From the outside the 500 brought a smile to my face, and first impression getting in was of how impressive the interior is, and that goes for all models, from the Pop upwards. The dash is amazing, and the finish and materials are solid with a nice quality feel. The driving position is excellent with the gear lever positioned well and the height adjustable seat and steering wheel adding the final touches.

On the road the first thing you notice driving the 500 is the precise and certain feel to it. It isn't the quietest car in the world on acceleration, but the feel is very solid and assuring. The steering is easy with the very effective and well balanced power assistance, and the gearbox clutch and brakes are all superb.

The best way of describing the performance is "well mannered". It feels particularly ideal for Jersey because it is nice and sedate until you want to put your

Main Workout for ski training

It seems like with the great snow conditions this year, more people than ever are heading off to go skiing or boarding, so I will show you a few of the tricks and techniques that I am using with my clients in the gym. Remember whatever effort you make now, will be paid back on the mountainside. (15-20 reps for stamina and endurance for legs and core stability)









One Legged Bosu Squat

Stand with one foot on the rounded side of the bosu ball, hold a medicine ball out at arms length and squat up and down putting most pressure on the foot that is on the bosu.

2. One Legged Squat

Great for balance and strength, stand on one leg, hold the medicine ball out in front of you and slowly lower and raise your

3. Step Jumps

Essential for getting a bit of spring into legs, jump from the floor onto to the step landing with bent legs, then from the step to floor landing in a squat position. Use your flexibility to make the landings as soft as possible.

4. Cable Chops

Grasp the cable up high, and pull it diagonally across your body, making sure you twist at the waist when drawing it across your body.

Finally have a great time, and stay safe!





are you sitting comfortably?

{diary of trying to correct some serious neck and shoulder pain}



When I was younger I was heavily encouraged by my Mum to learn to play the piano. I learnt a few things, played a few Beatles tunes but then discovered skateboarding and alchohol. Therein lies the reason that today, unfortunately, I don't know my C from my C sharp, I didn't stick with it. What I learnt over the Christmas period is the same is true of sorting out a physical ailment. With a few weeks holiday thrown into the seasonal mix I found that by the time I got home from my 'break' my neck had stiffened up and poor Lisa was almost starting from scratch! However, with some regular visits in January I'm once again turning my neck a little more like a human being and feeling better with every session. I've said every session so far that if I suddenly invented a more satisfying alternative to air and made a fortune I'd have a personal physio. They could come on holiday too!

First visit back in the New Year and although all my thoughts are positive about making this the year to get myself flexible and healthy, my neck and shoulders appear to think otherwise. As you'd expect, with a good few weeks since my last visit to Lisa, my body has tightened up despite some stretching and swimming. I really feel there's nothing that can compete with the intense muscle massage and mobilisation I get from my visits here. I've discovered that the principle source of my woes is my left trap (trapezius muscle) that connects from my middle back to shoulder to neck in a sort of triangular sail shape. My long held shoulder injury, coupled with my 'stuck to a Mac designing a magazine' posture, when combined with underactive middel and lower back muscles seems to have left everything well out of kilter. We worked hard on the part of my trap running from my shoulder up to the top of my neck today which, although mildly painful, felt soooo good. Lisa tests my head rotation at the beginning of each session and then again throughout the process to check our progress. I'm happy to say that after 45 minutes I was beginning to show some

I've definitely felt better since my last visit. My niggles have been there, the slight headaches and neck ache but there's been a marked improvement. After realising how important it is to maintain my programme of recovery, I'm considering, on Lisa's recommendation, visiting a sports massage therapist between my sessions

to keep me limber. That is going to allow

Not only does Lisa know exactly where the muscles I need work on are, she knows how to position my neck and head in such a way to improve my movement and keep the muscles working to recover my flexibility long-term.

Lisa to get to the serious stuff of correcting my problems rather than just keeping my muscles loose. Today's session worked further on the upper areas of my neck that feel as if they literally attach right into the base of my skull. It feels pretty weird having someone massage up in there!

It's certainly effective. If there's one thing that bothers me it's thinking I've gone for a massage and having someone just run their fingers over my back with some oil to the sound of some panpipe mood music. If it's not actually going to help my muscles I'm not interested! Not only does Lisa know exactly where the muscles I need work on are, she knows how to position my neck and head in such a way to improve my movement and keep the muscles working to recover my flexibility long term. It's amazing the difference that correcting other parts of your body can have on restricted movement. By tucking my head right into my neck and shrugging my shoulders slightly, I get a much wider range of neck movement. This apparently indicates to what degree there is tension and knotting in my trap.



That last session really worked and I've had no ill feeling since. Hopefully this bodes well for the rest of my sessions this year. With a little more work today I

was feeling looser with an improved range of movement. The moral of this month's sessions: keep up the good work. There may be no quick fix to problems like mine but sticking with it will be the answer.

The problem painful areas can then be stabilised to help avoid recurrence of pain and flare-

ups. This allows you to perform at your best.

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

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
