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



MAN'S HAND PULLED OFF IN TUG-OF-WAR



A Chinese man lost his hand when it was ripped off at the wrist during a tug-of-war contest.

Mr Shi, 30, of Shenzen, joined the beach tug of war competition with more than 100 of his colleagues.

"I had done tug-of-war before. It was all fun and safe," he told the Guangzhou Daily newspaper.

Entrants were divided into teams of five with Shi taking up the back position on his team. To stabilise himself, he wrapped the rope around his wrist and threw the loose end over his shoulder.

His match was heading for a draw when members of the audience started helping both teams to try to end the stalemate - without noticing Shi's hand trapped in the rope.

"I called on people to stop, but my voice was too quiet to be noticed," he said.

The competition was eventually halted when people noticed Shi holding up his damaged limb.

He was rushed to the Guangzhou Harmony Hand Hospital where his severed hand was reattached in a five hour operation.

Hospital president Liang Ming said it would be another 10 days before it was known whether the operation had been a success.

"His hand was pulled off by strong opposition forces. We can only amputate if it fails. Even if the operation was successful, he may never do delicate work with his hand again," he said.

such were entitled to a salary, overtime, paid holiday and so on.





or many the historic image of Northern Ireland is 'The Troubles', the three decades of ethno-political conflict between Roman Catholics and Protestants (there were 30,000 British troops stationed here at one point, compared to half that in Afghanistan). This is, however, a nation keen to forget the troubled past and move on. The jewel in the crown of this renaissance is Belfast, an incredible city with a fascinating past and a great looking future. The Northern Island Visitors' Guide describes the city as having been 'reborn' and there is evidence everywhere. They say you have to go into the dark to see the light and the city has a vibrance and depth that seems to now embrace the past rather than forget it.

It was only when I began researching the trip that I found out about Belfast's incredibly ambitious and entrepreneurial past. It was the world's largest linen producer at the turn of the 19th century, the home of the first aircraft manufacturing company in the world, the city that built the Titanic and ironically (considering the climate) the birthplace of air conditioning.

Evidence of the industrial past is everywhere, now fused with pioneering modernist architecture, exemplified by the temporary location of a huge viewing wheel adjacent to the Edwardian City Hall, an initiative by Belfast to allow visitors a view of the amazing building during its renovations and also a bird's eye view of the rest of the city. Another great vantage point lies at the top of one of Belfast's newest developments, Victoria Square, a great shopping centre and also the location for a rooftop glass biosphere-style viewing platform from which you can see the whole city.

Mlxing transport and tourism

If you'd like to take a less stationary view of the city then one of the finest ways to explore is by utilising the unique **Black Cab Taxi Tour** of Belfast. Our driver, Billy, was a Wikipedia of city information who guided us everywhere, offering historical commentary, a political education and entertaining anecdotes - not only about the city and the nation but also a few jokes.

We travelled around the Shankill area and through the peace wall and around Crumlin road, which is a fascinating journey into Northern Ireland's past. We also cruised the city quarters. There are now seven in the whole city which, whilst defying conventional mathematics, provide a variety of sub-sections of the city to digest bit by bit. The Cathedral Quarter proved to be our main stomping ground. Formerly a

trade and warehouse district, the area has become a main proponent of Belfast's progressive new identity; a melting pot of Quirky pubs, low key stylish eateries and also the location of **The Merchant**, one of Belfast's most impressive hotels (above). It's not overly expensive but even if you don't choose to stay on your first trip, William, the concierge, is happy to show you around. Everything in the hotel is antique but the building somehow manages to maintain an air of contemporary cool (the cocktail bar is a must for all visitors). If you don't fancy cocktails the lively **Spaniard** pub is just around the corner. Pubs are something Belfast does well! In a land so troubled by religion it seems the dedication to the pub is almost a means of national unification.

We stayed at the **Europa Hotel** which is conveniently located opposite **The Crown Bar,** one of most characterful pubs I've ever seen, complete with private booths that once used a bell system to order drinks anonymously from the bar. The Crown Bar also serves as the start the Historic Pub Walking Tour, one not to miss, surely? Our hostess Judy guided us round, pointed out the history and entertained us as we necked a drink in each pub. It's a civilised affair (Judy doesn't drink herself) but it certainly works up either a: an appetite or b: a hangover, depending on your level of dedication. Belfast's pub scene is complemented by a broad range of quality eateries. We sampled a cross section, taking in the seafood delights of the Ginger **Bistro**, a buzzy and lively little place with a real personal feel and I also myself to Food envy watching Kirsty cook her steak on the hot stone at **McHughs**, which overlooks the Bronze statue of 'The Speaker' in Custom House Square, once the site of Belfast's 'speaker's corner'.

Entertainment & Shopping

Although Belfast isn't the biggest city in the world it definitely has the entertainment and shopping facilities that Jerseyites hanker after. All the brand names are there; Urban Outfitters, G Star, Zara, H&M, Apple Store and the amazing Lisbon Road, dubbed the 'Bond Street of Belfast'. I always worry about descriptions like that but it is a great walk, full of boutique style independents. Belfast has broad entertainment facilities such as the Opera House (which used to be a circus).

Attractions

Examine Belfast's shipbuilding history around the Titanic Dock and Pump House and a visit to **SS Nomadic**, the former tender to the Titanic that is currently being renovated after life on the Seine as a floating restaurant. In addition to the attractions of Belfast, it was the natural beauty of Northern Ireland that drew me to the trip and no short break would be complete without a trip to the Giant's Causeway which you can visit on a bus tour direct from your hotel (although we'd recommend hiring a car to get the most out of it). It's been voted Northern Ireland's top attraction and for anyone with took a bit of interest in Geography, it's not to be missed.

Getting there

Our four day trip (Jet2 Fly Wednesdays and Saturdays) was the perfect length of time to get a taste of the city. We're certainly planning on going back for another trip. Jet2 flights from Jersey to Belfast start from £23.99 one way (including tax).





Croatia? Yes, this Central European country and idyllic stretch of coastline where the Adriatic meets the Dalmatian Coast, plays host to an intimate boutique garden festival each summer.

By 2005 The Garden in Zadar had already established itself as one of the best loved and most musically adventurous additions to Croatia's nightlife and culture. So much so that the owners of the nearby Pinija Hotel in the enchanting 900 year old village of Petrecane approached them about taking on an event space which had been dormant for some years.

The event space in question was a 70's designed complex, set on a pine tree covered peninsula with a circular nightclub, large outdoor terrace and a circular beachfront cocktail bar. With huge renovation, the first Garden Festival was created in 2006.

The 3 main areas in the festival include the terrace hosting the main live stage, Tiki Bar, also with its own dance floor terrace overlooking the sea and then Barbarella's Discotheque for the after-parties. That's not forgetting the legendary Argonaughty Boat Parties, which set sail twice a week for fun and frolics on the open sea.

Expect to see live bands and DJs from all aspects of dance music culture coming together to play and party. And there isn't many festivals you can return from having said you swam in the glistening Adriatic Sea, relaxed beneath the pines or danced under a canopy of stars.

It's been promoted almost totally via word of mouth over the first few vears, and the numbers turned from hundreds into thousands. The capacity is only 2,000, which keeps the festival's intimate appeal. This year, it's being held over two weekends, which means you can attend one weekend or the other or if you have the stamina, spread your trip over the 15 days. There is plenty to enjoy in the stunning village of Petrecane including lovely seafood restaurants, friendly cafes or a spot of morning yoga which adds to the festival experience enormously and is just a couple of minutes' walk around the bay.

The sun is setting later, the temperature is hotting up, and we think it's time to go out into 'the garden'!



A Family Affair

This month sees one family's talents displayed for us all to enjoy. 'Fission for home' features work from 5 members of previously Gallery-featured artist Alex Chase White's family. Alex's father and grandmother paint, whilst his mother writes poetry and girlfriend does collage and photography.

There is no specific theme to the exhibition, but rather it openly celebrates a creative family energy, with each artist presenting their individual and personal discoveries.

Expect to enjoy an unusual and varied collection of small works consisting of different styles and approaches through three generations with oil paintings, pastels, watercolours and photo-etching presented alongside poems and cyanotypes (a process using UV light sensitive chemicals, these produce a blue coloured image hence the the word 'cyan')



The small selection of drawings and paintings that were chosen by Alex's father Chris, reflect occasional work over the past decade. Some of it is simply the observation of things found on the beach whilst others are attempts to focus on aspects of landscape. The images of people are all anonymous faces but express some of the complexities and struggles of human personality. Chris says, "the way in which colour portrays mood has always interested me. What is refreshing about doing art at the moment is to discover that paint is handling in a different way than I used to handle it years ago. I seem more content now to let things go wrong or even take a shape of its own making. It is difficult to say when a picture is finished and some unfinished states always have the potential to take several different directions. The important thing is that art keeps happening and constantly surprises us. It is never happy to be controlled for too long. I hope you enjoy some of these images and feel encouraged to re-discover art for yourself".


First Lynda's body mould was prepared using Alginate which is completely harmless and good for the skin. A layer of paper is put on top to retain the moisture.

Will Ferrell has built a career upon his ability to deliver big laughs on an astonishingly consistent basis. Whether it be on Saturday Night Live, his website Funny or Die.com or in his various movie roles he has met with widespread acclaim and box office success. He is of course best known for playing variations on his maniacal man-child persona. From Anchorman's Ron Burgundy to Step Brothers' Brennan Huff his characters are incredibly likeable and endlessly quotable. That is not to say Ferrell is a limited actor. Those who have seen Ferrell's startling lead performance in the hugely underrated Stranger than Fiction will attest that he possesses major dramatic ability too. His CV is almost spotless with one very notable exception - Bewitched. His performance in this muddled rom-com was so lacklustre that many critics went so far as to write off Ferrell as a bona fida headline movie star. The question has to be asked, why then is Ferrell once again heading into re-make territory by headlining another adaptation of another 70s American TV classic?

The first thing to look at is the source material. The Bewitched television show whilst justifiably lauded (it still runs in syndication today) was very much a product of its time. It was so closely associated with the template of the early sitcom that it's not surprising that producers on the 2005 film felt the need to go down a metafictional route. Land of the Lost on the other hand would seem more at home on modern television than the time it was produced. The story of a father and his two sons transported to a mystical world filled with dinosaurs and warring tribes, its concept driven storytelling is a precursor to modern hits like Heroes and Lost. The parallels between this and J.J Abrams' castaway drama in particular are astonishing. Rather than build around the mythology as Bewitched did, the creators of this latest effort will have had more trouble choosing what to leave out.

Having the source material is important but maybe even more important is how this source material is treated. Bewitched shows almost a level of disrespect to the show that spawned it. Elements of the original reverberate in the film within a film format but there is a pervading sense that there is something missing from the original concept that the film needs to provide. Land of the Lost takes a different approach by not trying to replicate the television shows success by pitching as a straight drama but instead viewing the original idea from a comedic standpoint. It has been compared to the recent Starsky & Hutch as the initial ingredients remain the same but with different meanings attached. For example instead of the father and two sons we have three adult companions and the chance of a romantic relationship (father-son romantic relationships would have been frowned upon even in the 70s) between Ferrell and Friel's characters.

Finally there is the cast. Central to Bewitched is the relationship between Ferrell and Kidman. Everything in the narrative functions on the spark between their characters. The film ultimately fails because this is completely lacking. The trailers to Land of the Lost suggest that whilst Ferrell and Friel's characters drive the story there is not such a weight placed on their shoulders. Future comedy superstars Danny McBride and Jorma Taccone round out the main cast ensuring it is not entirely down to Ferrell to bring the laughs.

Land of the Lost is on the surface not the safest of bets for Ferrell as he attempts to establish himself as a blockbuster headlining actor. Still, there is plenty to suggest this is not going to be another Bewitched. Here's hoping the comedy plays close to Ferrell's self generated output and doesn't lose quality by going for too broad an imaginary demographic.

BORAT

After the huge success of 2006's Borat, Sacha Baron Cohen wisely sticks to the same formula as he brings his flamboyantly homosexual Austrian fashion reporter creation to the big screen. There looks to be the same mix of real life situations and outrageous comedy skits largely revolving around the character's adopted son O.J. It's difficult to believe but judging from the trailer it's quite possible that Cohen has devised a character even more offensive to the American public than Borat.

HARRY POTTER & THE HALF BLOOD PRINCE (PART 1)

The irrepressible man/boy wizard is back in this first instalment of the two part adaptation of the sixth book in the series. Last time Harry and his friends were beginning to notice girls and this time they're trying to get laid by any means necessary (Or is that American Pie?). In all seriousness the films have gotten better as the material has gotten darker and this looks set to continue. The only major question mark hangs over whether the book can be adapted into two equally satisfying films rather than one film separated into two parts.

ADVENTURELAND

It may sound like the name for a mini golf course but it is actually the title of the new indie comedy written and directed by Greg Mottola (Superbad). Starring Jesse Eisenberg (The Squid & the Whale) with support from big names Ryan Reynolds and Bill Hader it is the story of a high school graduate forced to work at the decrepit local theme park to get money for college. So far the film has received almost universally positive reviews and looks set to follow in the footsteps of Garden State and Juno by crossing over into the mainstream conscience.

ADAPTATION


Rarely does a week pass by without a remake or reimagining of an exisiting concept finding its way to our screens. So far this summer we have had Wolverine, Star Trek and Transformers head to our screen from the world of comics, television and toys.

Some purists believe this is somehow cheapening cinema as an art form. They demand original ideas rather than rehashes of whatever has proven popular in other media. Yet, some of cinema's greatest works are adaptations. The Godfather films are adaptations of Mario Puzo's novels. The Shawshank Redemption injects brutal emotion into what was seen as one of Stephen King's supposedly lesser works. Even the great Walt Disney adapted most of his stories from classic fairy tales. What then makes a great adaptation? Is great source material necessary? What makes the difference between a Dark Knight and a Batman & Robin?

First I think you can discount the notion that to make a great film you need great source material. Transformers came from a Japanese toy line, Pirates of the Caribbean was inspired by a theme park ride built in the 6os. In Charlie Kaufman's aptly titled Adaptation he creates a complex mind bending drama from an article about orchids. At the same time great source material is no guarantee of a successful product. This is especially evident in the comic book movie genre, with Elektra and Catwoman possibly the worst offenders. Both had strong and complex female leads with numerous stories from some of comics' top creators to choose from. Instead the filmmakers paid no attention to story and instead concentrate on the task of giving the audience a boner by dressing their respective leads in as revealing a spandex outfit as censors will allow in a 12A rated movie.

I think the difference between a good and bad adaptation comes down to spirit. The content of the text can change as does the method of delivery but for an adaptation to be successful the heart of the piece must remain intact. Take The Dark Knight as an example; the film allows the character to grow in ways his comic book counterpart as part of an ongoing serial could not. Yet, at the heart of it both characters remain heroic vigilantes both haunted and driven by a shared tragedy. Harvey Pekar's American Splendour does this in a different but equally interesting way. The narrative of the film takes a documentary form more about his biographical comics than an adaptation of any story in particular. However, in doing so the narrative comes to take the shape of one of his comics leaving the audience with the same sort of feeling that they'd get from reading a Pekar story.

Adaptations walk a fine line between proper respect for the source material and ensuring whatever they're filming is suitably cinematic. The Lord of the Rings trilogy is maybe the highest profile example of film managing to both please the die-hard fans and have widespread appeal. Peter Jackson succeeds by equally valuing the cinematic and the more difficult to define story thread (Even if the third film could have lost about four endings). Maybe adaptation could lose some of its stigma if the minds behind messes such as Alien vs Predator and Catwoman followed this Oscar winning director's lead.

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





Cracking...

It's one of life's supreme ironies that once you've slimmed down enough to squeeze yourself into your brand new bikini or flaunt your six-pack, it's time for summer food. And summer food is all about glorious excess.

Sizzling beach barbecues, ice-cold beer, melting Mr Whippys and salt 'n' vinegar soaked chips deserve to be enjoyed with finger-licking abandon. After all, dieting may be de rigeur in March, but it's as unsexy as socks and sandals in the heady days of summer.

But don't worry, the Crab Shack on St Brelade's beach has come up with the perfect beach food that won't leave a bulge in your bikini body – a whole range of seafood tapas plates called 'Shackatisers'. Ideal for sharing with friends over a few glasses of wine, there's everything from crab claws to baby ribs, tempura squid to a tomato, guacamole and mozzarella salad, oysters, moules and smoked salmon. The more of you there are, the more choice you'll have. And that's not all; there's main courses on the menu that range from lunchstyle salads, homemade beef burgers and chicken piri piri Portuguese rolls to huge platters of local seafood, whole crabs to crack yourself and the very

popular barbecue ribs. There's also a kids menu with mini versions of the adult dishes on the menu. The Crab Shack serves real summer straightfrom-the-beach food, and it's the sort of place that doesn't mind you getting sand on the floor. In fact, relaxed and laid-back is what it's all about; the décor is more beach hut than your average restaurant, with a selection of quirky marine ephemera lining the walls, and mismatched wooden chairs, and the ultimate surfer porn — a dvd of waves playing constantly on a widescreen.

We tried a couple of Shackatisers as starters—the crab claws and the tempura squid. The squid was deliciously salty and not too chewy - perfect finger food with a chilled beer or wine. The chunky crab claws come ready for you to crack, and they're crammed full of fresh white crabmeat. It's good quality food, after all, the Crab Shack is a Jersey Pottery restaurant, so you can be assured that ingredients are locally-sourced where

possible. And everything's easy to eat. Take the Thai mussels for instance, served steaming hot in a not-too-hot coconut and coriander sauce with chips on the side. Delicious. So much so that my date finished his mussels and started slurping down the leftover sauce like soup. It's a good job the Crab Shack has such a relaxed atmosphere... I had the crab linguini - plump, shiny linguini tangled with white crabmeat and wilted greens. It's a great mix of textures, the glistening warm pasta with the fresh sea flavours of the crab. and it comes in two sizes, less and more, depending on how much of a pasta pot-belly you can put up with. To drink, there's a relaxed wine and beer list and plenty of reasonable house wines available by the glass, including a crisp South African sauvignon that was perfect with our seafood.

But whatever you do, don't miss out on the 'design your own' ice-cream sundaes. You get a choice of ice-cream flavours, then have to decide which of the decadent toppings you fancy sprinkled over the top. We had the chocolate, Mr Whippy vanilla and



toffee ice-creams, topped with a handful of divine mini Oreo cookes and some rubbly rocks of honeycomb in all their toothgumming gorgeousness. Scrummy. And the beauty about the Crab Shack being right by the beach – a quick stroll through the surf and you've walked it all off... haven't you?!

Our verdict: Perfect beach food. With a great breakfast menu and moreish summer food like barbecue ribs, seafood platters and crab cakes, the Crab Shack's a top contender for lazy weekend brunches and post-sunbathing suppers.





Three times five equals...?

In North London, in the depths of Hackney, the sacks of Jersey Royals are empty, the asparagus has been demolished and the sea bream has been devoured. I am, of course, talking about Jamie Oliver's restaurant Fifteen...




I was lucky enough to see this firsthand as I got to spend a day in the kitchen of the Dining Room restaurant. On the 23rd May I donned the "Fifteen" embossed chef whites and entered into the hub of the restaurant to see a glimpse of these food artists at work. Never before have I seen so much passion and enthusiasm towards food and I was bowled over by everyone's encouragement for me to get in there and get cooking...so I did!

With the guidance of one of the main chefs, I was able to create one of the a la carte dishes from scratch, using a diverse and tempting mixture of fresh and seasonal ingredients to accompany the grilled Jersey bream - and was even treated to a dish of this after service. I was also left to my own devices to plate up the Jersey crab starter, which was a brilliant feeling and, as I like to consider myself a budding chef, being able to plate up a dish to restaurant standards and put all the components together, then seeing it being carried away by waitresses left me with an enormous feeling of accomplishment.

Working alongside two of the apprentices, I stirred up delicious risottos using nuggets of gorgeously green asparagus and watched on as elegant pasta dishes flew out of the kitchen. This may be an Italian restaurant at its roots, but the chefs and apprentices really have really put their touch on the dishes here, taking the traditional Italian cuisine and giving it a modern touch – of course with the help of some brilliant Jersey ingredients throughout May.





I couldn't leave without seeing how they treated our famous Royals and I was not disappointed. Marrying them with capers, mint, white wine vinegar and a "glug" of Fifteen's finely sourced olive oil – they took on a whole new level of taste – again traditional taken to a modern level. Wonderful!

Wendy Richmond the communication's manager at Fifteen commented on the Jersey promotion, saying "The sea bream, mackerel and the seafood was much enjoyed and of course the Jersey Royals. The cream and the strawberries made for fine desserts and were used in our signature panna cotta for instance. One of our apprentices, Claire Braine said it was her favorite promotion so far as she really enjoyed working with all these ingredients"

After interviewing the Fifteen team here in Jersey and talking about the produce they would be showcasing, it was great to see it flying off the kitchen pass to the customers and being able to physically see them enjoying the food from the open kitchen. It makes it all the more satisfying to know which producers have supplied the ingredients and seeing received so well in a restaurant outside of Jersey.

The following evening, I dined in the Trattoria restaurant, which is upstairs from the Dining Room. Having seen and tasted the food in the Dining Room, I was keen to compare the two. With its laid-back, large wooden tables, and elements of Italian produce donning the walls and various shelves, the Trattoria was everything I could ask for in a restaurant. The pasta was so tasty and satisfying, almost as though I had walked into a back street traditional trattoria in Tuscany and ordered the dish in situ, and the Jersey addition of the asparagus showcased the ingredient so well.

The sea bream that followed was equally as stunning. I could never have imagined that our little island of Jersey could add so much to the dishes from the king of cuisines, Italy. The bream was accompanied by sweet cherry tomatoes, fragrant basil and toasted foccacia pieces. I had to refrain from physically licking my plate clean... for fear I may have received some odd looks. Dessert was a dream to complete a perfect meal.

With our wine glasses empty, our appetites satisfied, and smiles all around, I left this little piece of Italy (or should I now say Jersey), hidden in the back streets of Hackney, feeling somehow like I had left my own little mark in the place and taken a great deal of knowledge away with me.



Something fishy is going on...

We are all out at sea this month at Gallery - and all the more reason to direct our foodie thoughts to the surrounding sea of Jersey.

It is never more than 20 minutes' drive to the shores on the island, so the restaurants are filled to the rafters with fresh sea food and the local fish vans are breaming with all sorts... And I am sure if you stroll down the pier at Gorey you will see some pier fishermen reeling in some fresh mackerel - how much fresher can you get than that?

But now more than ever, we need to be wise about what fish and seafood we buy as sustainability is such a problem. Buying in season and locally is the first tip, understanding and learning more about what is available and getting to know your local providers are also paramount.

After talking to a local Jersey fisherman, who also happens to be a member of the B.A.S.S. association, he commented on the decline of bass amongst other fish in our waters, explaining that the small bass we so often see and catch inshore will probably not have had a chance to breed. In fact, bass don't tend to breed until at least 2lbs in weight, which takes them about 4 years.

"Rod and line caught bass also tend to taste nicer than those that are trawled or netted, as they have been killed quickly, using the same principles that the Japanese apply to their tuna for sushi! You should also try and avoid fish which are too old and big, as they won't be as tender, and can build up toxins in their body's over long periods. A 5lb bass will be about 10 years old, and

that's longer than ideal for eating."

So the moral

is - try and buy fish

line caught bass are marked as such, and tend to sell for a premium. This is a common story and is becoming more of an issue – but by heading into the local markets and talking to our local providers, we can start buying fish such as gurnard, pollack, tilapia, coley, and pouting and begin to replace the likes of cod, haddock and halibut that we use in everyday cooking. These sustainably caught fish sources are equally as tasty,

if not more so and don't cost the earth.

But we can still buy good varieties of

bass and bream, we just have to know

where it is from.

I am all for trying new foods and so too are our local restaurants it would seem - the change in attitudes is being reflected in their kitchens. They are now buying their stocks from good sources, for example, sustainable bass can be caught off the coast of Cornwall and a multitude of varieties from surrounding Jersey waters. For example, restaurants such as Danny's at the Harbour View, are doing all they can to support our local fishermen... and Danny does all he can to shout about buying this subject stating; "I want to know where it was caught and by who. I insist on freshness and will always send any fish that I am not 100% happy with back to the supplier."

You only need to type tilapia or pollock into the internet and you will find an abundance of recipes right at your fingertips to get you inspired. Tilapia is lovely grilled with some mango salsa (see the "in season" article) or try cooking pollack fillets with miso paste and serving it with some edamame noodles and Asian flavours... the choices are endless and enough to convince even the most skeptical.

Fillets of pollack and coley are meaty enough to be served instead of cod and haddock in the fish and chip shop - so there are no excuses even for this crowd of fish fans.


It is not just restaurants that are turning their thoughts to this topic; supermarkets are doing their bit too. We are now seeing a larger variety of fish available and even the more traditional varieties such as salmon are being supplied from sustainable sources, like the Alaskan wild pink salmon. Companies such as Fish4ever are huge supporters of this worldwide topic and source all their fish for their tinned produce from good sources. Their products can be seen in our shops and even in our health shops and they are well worth buying as their salmon boasts more omega 3 than other varieties.

There has even been a film made called "The End of the Line" that documents this problem, highlighting subjects such as the imminent extinction of blue fin tuna due to the increase in the western demand for sushi. Keep a look out for it.

In Jersey we are perfectly located to enjoy good varieties of fish and not feel that we are contributing to the ever increasing problem - so please head out to your nearest fish van, pop out to the fish market on your lunch and get talking to the people in the know. Before you know it you will be an expert on all matters fishy!

The Jersey Fish Festival takes place on the Victoria Pier at the end of the month. It is a celebration of the Island's fishing industry maritime heritage and culture. There will be fishing skills workshops, seafood cooking demos from local chefs and a farmers' and craft market.

IN SEASON

Watermelon

What could be more satisfying in the heat of the summer than biting into a juicy, sweet and crunchy slice of watermelon? Watermelon can be used in both sweet and savoury dishes. It's great in a juice, blitzed up with some refreshing mint, or sliced into a salad for some extra texture, especially with the addition of basil. It matches brilliantly with scallops as a contrast in flavour. They are made up of 92% water, so they are thirst-quenching to say the least and provides a hefty dose of vitamin A, C, and potassium – beware though, it will take up a whole shelf to itself in the fridge!

Mangos

A satisfyingly sweet fruit – mangos are smooth, rich and a perfect all-rounder. Match with salty meats such as Parma ham for a Spanish style starter, or like the watermelon, add to a blender and make healthy juices. It goes well with chillis for a salsa to compliment a grilled piece of fish or chicken. They have brilliant health benefits; they have a certain enzyme with stomach-soothing properties, they also act as a digestive aid and contain plenty of fibre. Use they while they are in season and make some sweet chutneys to last you the winter - it'll go perfectly with cold ham, and even a spicy curry.

Broad beans

A simple, uncomplicated but beautiful member of the bean family. They need minimal cooking, two minutes tops in boiling water when at their prime and with the addition of some other seasonal produce can be made into a great salad or a warm side dish for grilled fish or roast lamb. The skins of the bean become thick and unappetising towards the end of the season and should be removed after July. By blending them up, you can make a delicious eastern dip - an alternative to hummous and they're a good source of protein for the vegetarians out there.

Basil

There's nothing more simple than placing slices of sweet summer tomatoes, creamy mozzarella and fresh basil together, with olive oil and cracked black pepper – a summer crowd pleaser. Basil is packed with flavour and marries well with Mediterranean ingredients. It creates a wonderful pesto, which can be used in a simple pasta dish or with fish and chicken. Thai basil is becoming more common now and helps to create a beautiful Thai beef salad, easy for any summer BBQ. Although it may seem odd, it's a good partner with strawberries, especially in summer cocktails!

Scallops


These meaty pebbles are elegant and sweet flavoured. Great served traditionally with pork belly, rocket or bacon, but refreshingly different matched with Asian influences such as ginger and chilli. Look for firm, plump scallops and never over cook – this is very common and easy to do. They should be firm to touch, but still give and should appear slightly opaque. Light as a starter or more filling included in a paella or a seafood stew. We get some of the best in the world from our seas and can get fantastic scallops here in Jersey – splash out and impress at your next dinner party.

Artichokes

Literally named, as the small firm thistle centre, with its spikes has been commonly known to choke people. Easily removed, they are buttery to taste and worth the preparation. Slice the top off down to the more firm leaves, strip until these leaves become more lime green in colour, shave the outer skins of the stalk and slice in half removing the choke. Once boiled, they are delicious grilled in a pan or on the BBQ and can be enjoyed both hot and cold. Great in pasta, with cold meats in an antipasti and in salads. Extremely high in nutrients and very low in calories.

Imagination for Design

Vision, and a passion for property has lead Cynthia Le Masurier to create dream homes. Where one person sees walls, bricks and rubble, Cynthia sees a delightful property called Pear Tree Cottage.

It all started when Cynthia and her husband, Mervyn built a house many years ago and extended it. "I always had a hand in changing things", said Cynthia. Six years ago they bought a Tudor house in St Brelade and next door was a plot of land upon which they decided to build their current house, Richmond. It took about a year to build the large Georgian-style house but once it was finished, Cynthia was eager to commence another project.

Barry Le Beuvant, an architectural technologist and friend of Cynthia's, took her to a site in St. John that used to be a pigsty, and already had planning permission. It was an unattractive and overgrown site, "Mervyn said he didn't know why I was looking at it" Cynthia explained. However, Cynthia fell in love with the area and thought of building a quaint one-bedroom cottage with a decked area, garden, and space for two cars. The property was named Pear Tree Cottage. "It was difficult to access the site and the neighbours put up well with us using the digger. After the cottage was built I could imagine all the neighbours inviting each other over for coffee, the person who bought the cottage had a dog as did all the neighbours so I could see they would be a nice unit together."

"Once Pear Tree Cottage was nearly finished I wanted another project, I'm not a developer as such, it's a hobby." Another two sites became of interest to Cynthia, one was located in Noirmont and the other was a run down old shack in Les Landes. "The day we visited the Noirmont plot we made an offer which was accepted". The plot transformed into a luxury three bedroom house with a cloakroom, utility room, study, conservatory and open plan kitchen, lounge and diner. "We furnished the property ourselves and also did the open viewing ourselves. A gentleman from England who is locally born had seen the property on the agent's website and flew over for the viewing and decided to buy it that same day." At present the shack is still in the process of obtaining planning permission but Cynthia has an idea for an upside down house with a balcony and glass structure in order to make use of the views of the surrounding meadow. "When there are no plans already drawn up for a site you have to look at your neighbourhood and decide what fits, you have to go with what is in the surroundings and I work with other people to get a design that works best for that area.'

The couple's stunning family home, Richmond, in St Brelade was built four years ago and is on the market. "We are only selling our house because we want to build another house on a site which is more rural and has a potential sea view." Richmond has a large kitchen and dining area and this is "the hub of the home". "We previously lived in a barn conversion and I always missed out on what was happening in the lounge when having dinner parties because it was closed off, here, the kitchen, diner and lounge are all together." I would like to be able to help my three children so that

they can stay in the island. My dream is to have a large plot in order to build first time buyer homes for young Jersey people."

Mervyn and Cynthia initially worked together on the properties but it is Cynthia who has since taken the reins on their projects and loves being involved in every aspect of the build - not just the interior design. "I would go up and down ladders, be on site in the rain and would bake cakes and take them up for the builders. I like to build high quality family homes which are open plan and more apt for family living because people need room to breath. I currently work part time at a doctor's surgery but would love to get more involved in all aspects of property design."



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

TELL OUR READERS ABOUT YOUR WORKING DAY.....

I start every day with a bowl of cereal, a glass of orange juice and a spot of tea. A quick shower, pack my bag and I'm out the door.

Having recently moved from Grouville to town I'm loving being able to walk to work in the mornings. Moving closer also means I get an extra half an hour in bed which can only be a good thing! It only takes me 15 minutes and all that fresh air puts me in a really good mood.

I usually aim to be at work for 8.30 so I can get half an hour extra studying in before I start the day – every little helps! The 9 o'clock tea round signals the start of the day, after that there is any number of things I could be tackling. 

FOR THE CANDIDATE

First impressions – no matter what type of vacancy you are pursuing, first impressions are important - be on time, dress appropriately and be prepared.

Do some research - know about the company you're applying to.

Apply for temporary positions – temping isn't just for students. Many professionals take this route into a permanent job – if you like each other, an offer may be forthcoming.

Consider a new career or change of direction – now may be the perfect time to pursue that dream job either straight away or by undertaking training.

Make your CV real. So many people claim that they are the 'best in their field' or 'work well in teams'. This is intangible on paper; so make your CV stand out by being genuine and succinct - ideally with good employers and strong referees.

Insist your recruiter screen and interview every candidate thoroughly before submitting their details; a supporting paragraph on each individual is useful - ensure your recruiter does this as part of the service.

No one likes paying fees and good recruiters like the idea of long term relationships; maybe negotiate fees based on volume

Recruiters should know their industry. Take the time to talk to them about industry news; this will help to develop the client recruiter relationship.



SCRAP THAT BANGER AND GET A DEAL WITH FORD

As the UK Government celebrates the positive impact of its car scrappage scheme on car sales, one Channel Island business has been doing a similar scheme for years.

Under the UK scheme, owners of vehicles that are at least 10 years old are given a £2,000 grant towards the cost of a new car and since it was launched, orders for new cars have increased by 35,000.

Iain Carse from Ford says that his company La Motte Ford in Jersey and Bougourd Ford in Guernsey has been doing a very similar initiative for more than four years.

'We have always had a minimum trade-in of between £1,500 and £2,000 depending on the make and model of the car being purchased and this has been a fantastic way of encouraging islanders to change their older vehicle for a much newer and a more fuel efficient one therefore more environmentally friendly. It is interesting that some of our competitors are jumping on the band wagon and now offering what we have been offering for years' he said.

'We have no criteria and accept vehicles that are either road-worthy or only fit for scrapping. If the old car is worth more than the trade-in then we will clearly give the owner a fair value for the vehicle and if it's only suitable for scrapping we arrange to scrap it. We definitely won't sell cars that we consider to be unroadworthy. It's our responsibility to remove them and make the roads safer. We have accepted cars in all sorts of conditions, we once even had a Land Rover pushed onto one of our forecourts as it didn't even have an engine and guess what, we paid £2,000 for it.'

Mr Carse said that with no MOT scheme in the Channel Islands, the minimum trade-in offered by Ford was one way in which they could encourage islanders with older cars to purchase newer vehicles.

'I am confident that there are a significant number of cars currently being used on our roads that would not pass an MOT and it is the motor industry's responsibility to do what it can to encourage these owners to get into newer vehicles,' he said.

BEAUTY WITH BITF

Sorry, it's not quite an aquatic car but the designers have admitted to taking styling cues from a shark at the front, and by the looks of it some form of crab at the rear.

This sleek yet muscular offering from Citroen has been noted as the first vehicle to be designed for a video game and then translated into the a physical, real world vehicle. The video game in question is of course 'the real driving simulator', Gran Turismo, which is where the car's name has been derived from - GT by Citroen.

Sitting a mere metre from the ground and a little over four metres long it oozes kinetic design, that is to say that you get the feeling of constant movement from the flowing lines and white to light grey gradient in the paintwork as it makes its way down the sides of the bodywork. Seating two adults in comfort and laden with current technology such as a heads up display, I hope it' comes with parking sensors because the lack of a rear window and those tiny wingmirrors make the parking situation seem like it could be slightly problematic.

MOUNTAIN-BIKING

It's tough keeping in such awesome shape when you've adopted a far more laid-back way of life than you used to have, like I've done...

Lucky for me though, Aaron from Jersey Bike Repairs called and said 'Hey Arnie, come mountain biking!'. Everybody has a mountain bike, right?

He's been busy organising the Jersey Hospice Downhill Mountain Bike Festival that's set to run in the woods at Greve de Lecq on the 18th & 19th of July. It's not just for the uber-fit and hardcore mountain biking types - there's a mini beer festival with accompanying acoustic music, a company challenge event and races for kids to be had too, all set at the Moulin de Lecq pub who are one of the sponsors along with Pentagon builders' merchants.

He's also the man to speak to if your bike needs tinkering with or upgrading, no matter what you ride. He'll collect and deliver and doesn't hang about either.

As the insurance premium on my worldwide renowned torso is so great it was good to hear that I'd be supplied with body armour and padding, but the £3k+ bike that was kindly being lent was a bit of a worry. I'll admit, it's been a while since I'd ridden a mountain bike and the price, albeit a shock, is definitely reflected in what you get. Disc brakes, six inch suspension travel all round, lightweight frame and best of all a small lever on the handlebars that when pulled or pushed lowers and raises the saddle respectively so you can adjust the height of it according to the terrain. This

sounded like it was going to get a bit technical.

Shaky at first, I was soon taking branches in my stride and avoiding obstacles without too much trouble - a bit like that scene in Terminator 2, you know, where I struggle to catch a juggernaut on my chopper. Except with less gates to shoot.

There are two trails down at Greve de Lecq, kind of like beginner and expert runs with sharp corners, water hazards, trees and 'north shore' which is the wooden decking you can see in one of the photos to help you pass the otherwise impassable.

Now, the legality of riding along cliffpaths and through woodland areas is currently somewhat cloudy in Jersey so whilst it makes good sense to enjoy a hit of adrenaline with your exercise, do be careful and respectful to the environment and other path/track users. The best way to get involved, enjoy yourself and not get in trouble is of course to enter yourself into the two day event happening this July - there will be races to suit people of all abilities and to find out more you need to speak to Aaron on 07797 914452.

The festival raised over £6,000 for Hospice last year and they're hoping to raise even more this year with junior, adult and 'company challenge' races in the woods and around the field adjoining the pub. Get involved, or just grab a beer and watch. Do it.

Look good on the beach in 4 simple steps:

1. Take to the hills or the beach!

Cardio is a must if you want to be lean and healthy. People will typically do long cardio sessions to 'burn fat' but this can take a long time and be tedious thus making it hard to stick to. To keep it fun and see that excess fat melt off, try doing cardio in short, intense bursts. Go to a moderately steep, short hill and run hard to the top, then walk back down for recovery.

2). Own the "big four!"

The squat, push up, pull up, and shoulder press are the best strength-building exercises, full stop. These WILL strengthen and tone.

3). Use barbells first!

The barbell is king. Notice none of the 'big four' are done sitting. Barbells require a lot more core stability than fixed resistance exercises and are way more functional, they use extra muscle to help stabilise and fixate the bar so therefore provide a much more balanced workout whilst burning more calories and balancing your body.

4). How do I get a flat stomach?

The key to abdominal definition is the visibility of the abdominal musculature, not the strength of the muscles. You can do one million sit-ups, crunches or whatever exercise you want and it will have no effect on abdominal definition. I recommend reducing the amount you eat and drink and training more often! For the core try the Front plank, Side plank, and Supine plank. Start with 30 second holds then build each session till you can do 60 seconds.
