

CHERYL FINDS OUT WHAT MAKES LIFE AT CASTLE QUAY UNIQUE



Following on from Castle Quay's success winning awards for Best Apartment Project and Best Mixed Use Development, I was keen to talk to some of the new businesses and residents on the waterfront. My first visit was to the coffee house Cooper & Co.

With names like Monsooned Malabar, Ethiopian Yergacheffe and Columbian Excelso, you know you're getting something special at Cooper & Co when one of its friendly baristas brews up your coffee.

Owner David Warr says he's been pleasantly surprised at how well the new branch at Castle Quay has been doing, as the waterfront hasn't been viewed as a commercial sector until recently. "At first it seemed brave setting up shop here, but there are so many others coming to the area now there's a great spirit developing," he says. "With parents dropping their kids off at the cinema or the swimming pool, they don't always want to go to a pub or restaurant while waiting for their offspring. So, they like to come here and relax with a coffee."

The other undiscovered gem that will come into its own this year, predicts Warr, is The Chart Room, a beautiful room that can be used by residents and the public alike. "I see it as a terrific place for people to drink tea or coffee and read the papers after they've been for a walk. People think it's only for residents, but anyone can use it."



time FOR TIFFIN - A RESTAURANT FOR EVERYONE

If you fancy a deli-breakfast, small bite for elevenses, afternoon cream tea, blowout three-course meal, grazing off a platter of Venetian cicchetti (Italian tapas), or a glass of bubbly and spot of caviar at the champagne bar, come to the Tiffin Tea House.

"A restaurant for everyone" is how owners Nick and Linda Wring describe their mash-up dining experience. The Wrings' Tiffin Tea House in Clevedon, Somerset is already reckoned to be one of the best places to eat in the Bristol area. Wring says he's bringing that notion over to Jersey, " but it will be six times the size and quite cutting-edge."

There's something quite pleasing about being able to choose just a glass of wine while enjoying the views of Elizabeth Castle, or going completely crazy and having The Full Monty in the 54-seater fine-dining area. It's rare to find a venue that caters for every mood, but Jersey's about to get it.

The service will be five-star, without being obsequious, adds Wring. "You'll always see staff, but no one will be overbearing. Our place is designed for the man-in-the-street wanting Heinz beans on toast or green eggs and ham (a Dr Seuss-Tiffin special with poached eggs, ham and wilted spinach), right up to someone splashing out on Louis Roederer, dim sum baskets and flamed scallops at the champers bar." There will even be a chef's table where the chef carves for you and talks about where your food came from for those who want to really push the boat out.


Wring says he's excited about being on the island,

where he sold blenders for smoothies years ago. "Tve watched Castle Quay being built and I think it's incredible. Once there's a buzz about it, it will become the area where people will want to be seen."

IN SICKNESS & IN HEALTH

After several years of hunting for a spot suitable for a brand new medical facility that's easy to access and has good parking, Dr Patrick Higgins says he and his team hit upon St Helier's waterfront.

What sold the doctors on the Castle Quay site was the multi-storey car park (with a lift) directly opposite, the ability to install disabled parking spaces alongside the surgery and a regular bus service from Liberation Station planned for the future. They will move into their 7,000-square foot space this June.

Assimilating two long-established practices on the island (York House Surgery and The Laurels Medical Practice), the new firm will consist of a grand total of seven General Practitioner Partners and three associate GPs. And because of the size of the establishment, there's plenty of room for ancillary services from a chiropractor, osteopath, physiotherapist and podiatrist.

Another exciting prospect is the provision of specialist services currently not available on Jersey, such as a link with The London Eye Hospital, the UK's leading lens implant centre for cataract surgery and presbyopia (a condition where the lens of the eye loses its ability to focus). Castle Quay Medical Practice also hopes to welcome a plastic surgeon to the premises on a regular

Another reason the new surgery will be sited at Castle Quay is so both patients and staff benefit from being on the waterfront. Higgins says he's pleased Cooper & Co with its excellent coffee, has already moved in. "But the icing on the cake for me will be when the champagne bar opens in March," he says with a smile. A sentiment that's hard to deny, as surely a glass of bubbly a day must be good for you.



Channel 4 haven't got back to me about my spin-off idea for Grand Designs ("Insane Survivalist Schemes") but I have managed




HOME & GARDEN:





here's something deliciously decadent about a 'weekend away' that's just a few minutes down the road. Mr & Mrs Smith join The Club ...and discover they don't want to go home.

'Glass of champagne Madam?' If only all check-ins were this civilized. Half an hour ago, we'd still been at home, my husband oblivious to his surprise treat, and now here we were, sipping champagne and soaking up the atmosphere of calm sophistication that The Club seems to be cocooned in. It's only five minutes away from town, but it feels like a different world.

Our luggage whisked away, we were free to stroll around the hotel as the receptionist gave us a leisurely tour. The library-style honesty bar where you can mix your own nightcaps, the sleek spa downstairs, the restaurant where we'd booked a table for dinner and Bohemia's cool bar, and then up to our room. A masterclass of immaculate contemporary design, all rich tones of charcoal and crème brulée, our deluxe suite had a corner sofa and striking artwork in the living room, and in the bedroom, a huge feather bed with plump pillows and crisp Frette sheets.

Our receptionist explained the room's features; one-touch heating, Bang & Olufsen designer phones, plasma TVs, tea and coffee, and the not-so-minibar with everything from single malt miniatures to a cheeky mile-high kit... I on the other hand

had been distracted by the bathroom – a luxury vision in marble and mirrors – and couldn't help letting out a squeal of delight. A walk-in shower with two showers so noone gets left out in the cold, heaps of Elemis toiletries and a gorgeous bath big enough for two. In no time at all I was lounging in a deep bubble bath, with a perfect view of the bedroom TV. Hotel room heaven.

Meanwhile Mr S (any excuse to use those Bang & Olufsen phones) had called down for a DVD from the hotel's impressive library and was stretched out in the living room with a beer and snacks from the minibar and the Bourne Ultimatum to watch while I got ready. It felt like homethat is, if we had an exquisitely furnished, ultra luxurious home at our disposal. We could quite happily have stayed in our room, mixing drinks and ordering room service (Massaman curry and crème brulee on 24-hour speed dial are enticing options) but we had a Michelin-starred supper waiting for us downstairs.

Staying at the hotel – or 'living upstairs' as we'd already come to think of it – lends a certain swagger to your step as you enter the lounge bar through the special hotel entrance, and stroll straight to your reserved seats, set out with menus to browse over cocktails and amuse-bouches. The menu has moved away from reams of à la carte dishes and inevitable indecision, and instead places you in the safe hands of the chef and ever attentive waiting staff as they guide you through one of five fantastic tasting menus, they even offer a vegetarian tasting menu!

The amuse-bouche of barbequed pork shoulder, then fresh crab meat served on apple and cucumber jelly with a touch of fresh wasabi and horseradish, set the tone for what was to be a truly world-class meal. Favourites from the Pescatorian tasting menu (that's a fish tasting menu to you and me...) were the haddock, with a rich hens yolk, and mustard ice cream drizzled with a creamy potato sauce (so good I could have drank it alone). Also the scallop with celeriac, apple, smoked eel and truffle grated generously at the table was spectacular. My Mr Smith paired his meal with the suggested drinks tasting menu which was an inspired touch, as well as combining crisp whites with the lobster and turbot, there was ice cold Grey Goose Vodka with the buttermilk oyster and chilled Hawkes Bay Gamay Noir with the scallops. We tucked gleefully into the cheese trolley and saw off their devilishly gooey Chocolate Mayhem dessert. The night flew by in a culinary spectacular.

Then it was just a stroll upstairs, via the honesty bar for a mix-it-ourselves nightcap, to our perfectly turned-down room, with a glass jar of homemade shortbread biscuits placed beside the bed. HOW TO GIVE A CAT A PILL

Pick up cat and cradle it in the crook of your left arm as if holding a baby. Position right forefinger and thumb on either side of cat's mouth and gently apply pressure to cheeks while holding pill in right hand. As cat opens mouth, pop pill into mouth. Allow cat to close mouth and swallow.

Retrieve pill from floor and cat from behind sofa. Cradle cat in left arm and repeat process.

Retrieve cat from bedroom, and throw soggy pill away.

Take a new pill from foil wrap, cradle cat in left arm, holding rear paws tightly with left hand. Force jaws open and push pill to back of mouth with right forefinger. Hold mouth shut for a count of ten.

Retrieve pill from goldfish bowl and cat from top of wardrobe. Call spouse from garden.

FAST LOVE?

A hot summer night, two slippery bodies entwined together, their passion enflamed by love darts - no it's not the latest steamy novel but two garden snails mating! Snails are hermaphrodite, each snail being both male and female. The love dart is made of a chalky substance and each snail shoots one into the body of the other. Sperm is then exchanged and, unfortunately for gardeners, both snails will then lay up to forty eggs.

After about a month these hatch into tiny miniature snails. As they grow their shells enlarge by material being added at the lip. Calcium is needed to make the shells so snails can only live in areas where the soil is alkaline.

Snails are nocturnal as their soft bodies would dry out in the heat of the sun. During the day they hide in shady places, curled into their shells. Like most snails the garden snail is vegetarian, making short work of the gardener's prize plants with its rasplike tongue. As it moves along on its muscular foot slimy mucus helps to protect the foot from sharp stones and so the snail leaves a shiny trail of slime as it crawls along.

The snail has two pairs of tentacles on its head which can be drawn inside the head. The back pair can detect light and act as the snail's eyes

Snails hibernate in winter, often in groups. They close the mouth of their shells with a plug of mucus so that they don't dry out.

Their shells protect them from many predators but thrushes are able to eat them by smashing their shells on a rock. Each thrush has a preferred stone, known as its anvil, and will eat many snails. They are also edible to humans and apparently taste like the edible snail but are not often used in cooking.

It is thought that the idea of Cupid and his love darts may have arisen from observing the mating habits of snails.

"Have I downed a beer in one, in the past 24 hours?"



Crime-fighting charity Crimestoppers is calling the initiative 'Seen something... Heard something... Said nothing?' and hopes that it will remind people that they can help bring lawbreakers to justice while being guaranteed complete anonymity.

'The charity fundamentally believes that people and communities should live free from crime and the fear of crime, and if you witness a crime or know one has been committed, the charity's preference is that you go to the police,' said Mr McClure. 'However, lots of people don't want to, or cannot, go to the police, and that is where we come in. They want to remain anonymous. They might be connected to the person who has committed the crime or it might be domestic abuse.

'The key to Crimestoppers is anonymity. We want to know what you know, not who you are. That is the big sell. We guarantee anonymity. You can do the right thing for yourself, your family and your community.'

Calls made to Crimestoppers are answered by staff at a call centre in the UK and so there is no chance that callers' voices will be recognised locally. Information can also be submitted anonymously online using Crimestoppers' secure Online Giving Information Form at www.crimestoppers-uk.org

PARIS CARNIVAL

Taking place annually since the 16th Century, the Paris Carnival is one of the oldest celebrations of its kind in the world and allegedly inspired the famous Rio Carnival. After taking a 50-year break, it returned to the city in 1997 and has been going strong in its modern incarnation ever since, attracting up to 40,000 spectators and employing 15,000 participants. With street performers, musicians, dancers, circus acts and actors taking to the streets of Paris on February 10th, this year's theme is 'the world of toys' and men and women are encouraged 'to dress as queens.' The highlight of the carnival is the Promenade de Bouef Gras (Fat Cow Parade), which

involves an actual REAL LIVE COW being paraded through the streets and followed by a procession of floats, performers and puppets. Nothing says 'I love you' like pointing at a cow.

MONTMARTRE WALL OF LOVE

whole week. With special film and music events planned for the celebrations as well, there's an awful lot to sink your teeth into.

PARIS SG VS BASTIA 40€

Valentine's Day isn't all about treating the ladies y'know, and indeed, many women like a bit of footy, so please don't think us unromantic for including a Paris Saint Germain match. the streets of Paris and along the Seine, and skaters are accompanied by a team of police escorts both on scooters and on skates (not at the same time), a medical team and a number of stewards. The Pari Roller is intended for people that have had some experience on skates before you don't have to know how to Misty Flip through a flaming hoop, but they do ask that you at least know how to brake, and don't mind going down the odd hill or two. SKI PARADISKI & THE 3 VALLEYS **VIA CHAMBERY**

ur winter flight connections to the Alps for skiers and snowboarders have improved again this winter with the introduction of Blue Islands Saturday to Saturday flights to Chambery. At JerseySki. com we have been sending people to Geneva and Zurich, and then mostly to resorts with no more than a 90 minute transfer time, so the new route opens up the possibilities of going to Paradiski and the 3 Valleys, and getting there sooner!

In mid December I went to see, and stay in, some of the resorts and properties that we are offering with the new route, and just like our reconnaissance trip of the previous December, it bucketed down with over a metre and a half of snow. The previous trip had been a little fraught as I had hired a fiat 500 which, after the first night, took nearly 2 hours to dig out and fit the snow chains; this year I had booked a seat Ibiza hire car, but was astonished when Europear upgraded me to a brand new Skoda Yeti 4x4 with winter tyres, this is the car that Jeremy Clarkson has called "the best car in the world." Result!

Our first stop was in Plagne Montalbert, which is small, compact and picturesque, but with access by chairlift into the massive linked areas of Paradiski. We stayed at Chalet Anniek, which is a premium service catered chalet, with sauna and hot tub, run by Ski Amis, who were nominated for the British Travel Awards "Best Ski and Winter Sports Tour Operator 2012". After 2 very pleasant days and nights exploring the 10 interlinked villages spread over several sides of a mountain that make up the La Plagne area, it was time to move across to the 3 valleys, once the snowplough cleared the road!

Courchevel 1850 has an airstrip, ritzy hotels and six Michelin starred restaurants, but its possible to do" Courchevel without the Courchevel price tag "by staying at the Hotel Olympic which is in a central position just 200 metres from the slopes. The sky cleared for a time while I was there so I hired some of the biggest, fattest,

rockered skis I could find, (Rossignol S 7's) and dropped in to the fresh powder!

Courchevel links up with Meribel and then over to Les Menuires and Val Thorens to make up the 3 valleys, the worlds biggest linked ski area with over 600 kilometres of pistes. Ski Amis also have some catered chalets with sauna and hot tub in Les Menuires which I was hoping to ski down to from Meribel Mottaret, but heavy snow closed in again with absolute zero visibility, and a high avalanche risk, so I decided to put it off for another time.

Meribel Mottaret is above Meribel and is a compact ski in ski out resort with interlinked galleries of shops bars and restaurants at it's centre. We stayed at the Hotel Mottaret which is unusual in the 3 valleys as it is all inclusive. There is a well equipped ski hire shop right next door to the hotel, and the pistes are 10 metres in front of the hotel, so it's all very convenient.

I hope you can join us on the slopes this winter!

EARING IN MIND THAT IT'S ALL ABOUT LUST IN THE FEBRUARY ISSUE, THE BREWING FEATURE DOESN'T NECESSARILY GET OFF TO THE BEST OF STARTS.

It's 8am on a freezing morning on the Longueville Industrial Estate. Tatty old clothes are the order of the day, and you can still see your breath in front of your face even having walked inside. No offence to my fellow brewers, but lust is about the last thing that springs to mind.

I've been signed up on a one-day apprenticeship at the Liberation Brewery with fellow novice Jo Reed, whose day-job is marketing for Liberation Group. Both of us have been on our fair share of brewery tours before, but have never previously rolled our sleeves up and donned our wellies. Jo's size-five boots are rejected because they still have Jersey Live mud on them, so she gets a replacement pair of size-nines, and we're good to go. Ready, steady, brew!

We're not helping brewer Pat Dean with any old ale, but a batch of Liberation Rouge that is to be submitted for the biennial Brewing Industry International Awards. Liberation won two gold and a silver last time around, in 2011, and hopes are high for further success. No pressure then...

Many breweries are automated these days, including the larger of Liberation's two

plants, but Pat's 'office' is a more bijou affair, and that means being hands-on, whether or not your wellies fit.

We kick off by heaving half a dozen 50-kilo bags of malted barley into an outsize (4-foot-high) saucepan, known as a mash tun, and adding hot water to give a big batch of porridge.

After an hour or so the liquid part of the mix, known as 'wort', is drained off. The solids are shovelled out into dustbins by yours truly to be sold off as animal feed – their journey across the Island will be chronicled in a future issue of Gallery, although I'm washing my hair that day.

The wort is transferred to a copper kettle, twice the height of the mash tun, and boiled with hops, which are the main source of flavour for beer. As with the barley, there's a specific recipe of different amounts of various hops for each different beer. Hops can cost as much as £17 per kilo, and are sourced from around the globe, with England, New Zealand and the USA being major growers.

>> Further hop flavour is imparted in another vessel, known as a hop back, after which the wort is transferred into a fermenting vessel. It has been as high as 70C during the process, but now is down to about 20C, a suitable mark to pour in a couple of gallons of gloopy light-brown yeast, which will start to work on the sugars in the wort and, by turning them into alcohol and carbon dioxide, making wort into a more appetising four-letter word – beer!

Once the yeast is added, which would typically be around seven or eight hours after getting started, it's necessary to sit back and wait. Fermentation times vary, but this batch of Rouge – about 300 gallons in all – will be ready in about four days, by which time thirst levels, and perhaps even lust levels, will be at bursting point.

Jo and I are thanked for our hard work by Pat, even though we are setting off without helping him finish off the clearing-up. We pledge to come back for another brew on another day, although if 'our' beer wins an award, we may get signed up by a Premier League brewer on a mega-bucks deal. Who knows, it might even involve a lucrative Wellington boot endorsement clause – if that's not something to lust after, then what is?

SPECIAL EQUIPMENT

2 non-stick blini pans or similar moulds

INGREDIENTS

1 tbsp sea salt1 large Marfona potato

6 eggs

1/2 tbsp chives

Salt and cracked black pepper Olive oil

1 tbsp milk

10g <mark>unsalted butter</mark> 100g <mark>smoked salmon</mark>

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 160°C (325°F/Gas 3). Sprinkle the sea salt on a small baking tray, place the potato on top and bake in the oven for 50 minutes.

When the potato comes out, put the blini pans/moulds on a roasting tray and into the oven to get hot.

Cut the potato in half and scoop out the middle into a bowl. Discard the skins. Weigh out 125g of potato and discard any excess. It is important at this stage that the potato is still warm.

Separate 2 of the eggs and add the yolks and half of the chives to the potato and whisk in well. Season with salt and black pepper. In a clean bowl, whisk the egg whites to firm peaks.

Using a metal spoon, carefully fold the whisked egg whites into the potato mix, taking care not to knock the air out of the whites.

Lift the blini pans/moulds out of the oven and add a drizzle of olive oil to each.

Using a spoon, divide the potato mixture equally between the pans/moulds.

Put back into the oven and bake for 15 minutes until cooked and golden brown.

Crack the remaining eggs into a bowl add the milk and whisk.

Heat the butter in a saucepan, add the egg mix and then turn the heat down to low.

Using a wooden spoon, move the egg mix in the pan until the eggs are just cooked. Finish with the remaining chives and remove from the heat.

To serve, place the pancakes in the middle of the plate, curl the smoked salmon on top and then add the creamy scrambled eggs.



Illa Rayson wouldn't be a bad place to live if it was dropped into the middle of a housing estate surrounded by tower blocks; you could always just draw the blinds and enjoy the great indoors. Throw in its actual location, a hundred or so steps from the beach and with stunning views across St Aubin's Bay, and it becomes a property that demands, at the very least, a second glance.

The three-bedroom, three-bathroom duplex apartment lies just back from The Avenue

in St Lawrence and has been refurbished to a high standard over the past five years by the owner, a property designer who collaborated with a London-based interior designer on the project.

Ascending a low-lit staircase from the front door, there's an immediate wow-factor on entering the drawing room, which has a high (2.7 metre) ceiling, Chesney stone fireplace, recessed shelves and cupboards and a Lutron lighting system that allows for a range of pre-set 'moods.'

There are views directly out to the east, but the eye's more likely to be caught by the south-facing vista: the room drops away to a sunken dining area with a bespoke table and huge windows on three sides, opening up the panoramic views stretching from Fort Regent to Noirmont Point. Doors open onto a huge balcony, which comes with the same views, surround sound system and LED lighting as the interior.

The first-floor also contains the kitchen, with granite work surfaces, under-floor heating and a large ceramic sink with a view. To the rear lies a small amenities room, keeping some of the household appliances accessible but out-of-sight, the stone-floored 'house' bathroom, and the master bedroom. The high ceilings in the bedroom are accentuated by a raised custom-designed headboard, while the room also features Victorian radiators, an

airing cupboard and an en suite showerroom with atmospheric lighting, doublewidth shower and sink and under-heated slate flooring.

Stairs – featuring a Victorian-style Mahogany balustrade – lead to the upper floor, which has two good-sized bedrooms, one of which has recently seen service as an office, with a small but well-appointed shower room in between.


Other features of the property, which is available through Choice Properties at an asking price of £725,000, include a private garden area with lawn and patio and four parking spaces.

Homebuyers' **FAQs**

Collas Crill property expert Charles Le Maistre answers some of your most common homebuying questions.

1) Am I a first time buyer?

There is often confusion over who a 1st time buyer is in Jersey and how this effects Stamp Duty. Quite simply, a 1st time buyer is anyone who has housing qualifications and has never owned, or had an interest in any property anywhere. A 1st time buyer can purchase by share transfer, flying freehold or freehold and assuming that the value of the property is less than £450,000 then they are entitled to a reduction in Stamp Duty or Land Transaction Tax (in the case of share transfer properties). 1st time buyers also benefit from reduced Stamp Duty in respect of any loan.

2) How is stamp duty calculated?

Stamp duty and Land Transaction Tax (LTT) is calculated on a fixed tariff based on the value of the property being purchased (but not including the value of any contents). Your lawyer can advise you of the total cost. Any borrowing which you use to finance your purchase will incur additional Stamp Duty or LTT, which is currently calculated at 0.5% of the borrowed amount plus an additional £80 registration fee.

3) What will my legal fees be and what other costs need to be considered?

Unfortunately, although they are the most significant, the consideration and stamp duty are not the only costs that need to be considered when buying a property. Fees associated with any purchase start with conveyancing fees, which vary according to the complexity of the transaction and the type of property being purchased. Don't be scared to pick up the phone, we offer free quotations and are more then happy to discuss the fees specific to your transaction. It is worth bearing in mind that cheap quotes often mean cheap service and any issues missed when purchasing, can result in expensive issues when you come to sell, so choose your lawyers carefully!







The Don Road site is a floor formerly occupied by Mourant above CDP Sigma. The floor is being completely redeveloped to offer brand new modern offices, most with windows to view the world and car parking near by at Green Street. Rents start from under £400 a month. The location offers an alternative to Wharf Street and Spencer points out that some clients are keen on the alternative location 23 offices will be created, most with windows and natural light and all with air con, toilets and kitchen areas. Some of the bigger offices are also available with car parking within the building.

The Esplanade building is already half rented with clients having seen the plans and nabbed some offices already. With both new buildings, it takes the total number of businesses able to rent from 40 to 75. That's 75 new small businesses able to find a new, clean, decent office at a good rent. 

We caught up with welterweight Boyd Munroe, one of the club's longest-serving fighters, to find out more about the sweet science.

How did you first get into boxing?

I first got into boxing when some friends started at South Hill Gym and told me about how good the training was, and I was a skinny kid so I wanted to learn how to look after myself, and boxing gave me confidence.

What does a typical training session consist of?

First we start with a steady warm up running around the gym with some exercises, then some shadow boxing, which involves working on your technique, then moving onto bag work. And usually we will do six rounds [three minutes each with one minute rest inbetween] of sparring, and then a fitness circuit to finish off.

What's been your most memorable bout so far? My most memorable contest would be boxing in front of an all time great in Sugar Ray Leonard at the Hotel de France, and to top it off he presented me with the boxer of the evening trophy!

You've been at Leonis for some time now – what have you seen change over the years? And has the club changed with the likes of coaches Miguel, Tony and Gerry in charge now that Dave Thompson's sadly no longer with us? Firstly, Dave was a truly inspirational man, a great coach and he would really know how to bring the best out of me! Miguel, Gerry and head coach Tony are doing a great job now. They always worked well with Dave and they also learned a lot from him.

You left boxing to concentrate on football for a while – how do the two sports compare in terms of the regime and in terms of the actual competition, and what was it that drew you back to boxing? Boxing for me is the best complete body training and you have to be so dedicated; we train for weeks on a strict diet. I never had the same passion for football as I do for boxing!

Boxing certainly polarizes opinion and most people involved are used to hearing people that say it's a barbaric sport which has no place in modern society – I'm sure you get the same thing from time to time. What's your response to people that are set against boxing? Yes, I suppose I usually get this from older women that possibly have never tried the sport. Boxing is a very skillful sport and takes many years to get to a high standard, and for me, as a teenager it gave me both self-confidence and something to focus on! It's a very safe sport these days and I don't see it as barbaric. If more youngsters took part I'm sure there would less on trouble on the streets!

Who are the best boxers you've seen come through the club, and who's looking good there at the moment? It would be hard to mention just one boxer over the years as there has been so many skilful boxers! But everyone training for this up and coming show February 9th is looking great and there is a few youngsters having there first contest so I wish them luck.

Which boxers have provided your greatest inspiration?
My 3 favourite boxers of all time have to be Muhammad Ali, sugar ray Leonard, floyd mayweather. But I could list a lot more.

What advice would you give to someone who wants to take up boxing? I would say come to up to south hill gym, it's a great sport and jersey Leonis is such a friendly place to learn. With a great team of boxers and trainers! Cheers Chris feel free to alter any of my poor English!



lose your eyes and imagine an incredible stretch of road. You're travelling along it at whatever pace suits your mood, behind the wheel of the one vehicle that you truly desire. It's nothing short of lustful indulgence.

My hands are gripped around a wooden rimmed wheel, my hair is being rapidly diminished by the escalating breeze, the deep howl of over seven litres of V8 resonates through my bones and I couldn't lift my torso forward for the forces of physics even if I wanted to. There are probably leather driving gloves involved too, you know, just to look the part. The one car I know I've always wanted to own since childhood despite never having even met anyone in a position to enable me a vain attempt at convincing them that they should let me drive theirs? An AC Cobra, and I'd probably drive it around just like I was in the film Twin Town, too.

I used to think that any self-respecting motoring enthusiast had to posess a fantasy collection list of biblical proportions, but I've managed to whittle it down to three, and now you've made it this far I might as well bore you with details of the other two and exactly why they're so special.

They say that everything's big in America, and so god bless Carroll Shelby, a Texan chicken farmer with a desire for racing. Taking what has since become a widely imitated and instantly reocgnisable British design and shoehorning in a selection of Ford V8 engines from the admirably sized 289cu up to an incredibly impressive 427cu (that's 7.2 litres this side of the Atlantic), the Shelby Cobra was famously demonstrated to prospective buyers with the use of a \$100 bill tucked behind the windscreen. If the passenger could lean forward and take it as Mr Shelby demonstrated his Cobra's absurd acceleration it was theirs to keep. Not only did he always win the bet, he won a hell of a lot of customers too.

Those of you in the know will likely have noticed a theme running here, one that involves British marques sporting large capacity V8 engines imported from the US. Jensen's Interceptor showcased British engineering along with Italian coachwork and American muscle and frankly, just looks fantastic. The long, sweeping bonnet, that fishbowl rear windscreen, acres of slaughtered cow tastefully and comfortably engulfing the interior, and of course, the noise. Who needs more that 3 gears anyway?

The final contender in my top three is even more of a mongrel than the occupier of the number two spot. A British design for a subsiduary of an American manufacturer who were bought by a French company, built in Scotland, refined in England and became the underdog and unidsputed champion of world rallying at the start of the eighties in the hands of Henri Toivonen. It can only be the Talbot Sunbeam Lotus.

I had one as a student at art college in the UK. Children pointed and people stopped to regale me with their tales of ownership or how one of their mates had one and it used to absolutely destroy their Escort RS2000, a once dominant force in rallying. One gent even went to far as to shout 'sad f*ckers like me get hard-ons over cars like this' as he walked by, and assuming that he meant it in a metaphorical sense, I too have become one of those people. Yet you never see one. Ever.

Its recipe for success? Take a lightweight, rear wheel drive hatchback with a compact wheelbase and add the canted over twin cam engine from a Lotus Esprit. The result? Incredible fun, incredibly hard to keep in a straight line and with an even more incredible risk of losing your driving license.

If you get freaked out by people seemingly talking to themselves when they're on Bluetooth, imagine how it'll look when they're watching a Youtube video of the world's weirdest cats on their Google Glasses.

HOW WOULD YOU BEST DESCRIBE YOUR MUSIC?

We're the folk music equivalent of a 9 person orgy!

We all bring our particular talents to the party - hopefully creating a busy, exciting sound that falls somewhere between pop, folk, and danceable 'World' music.

We're also the sexiest Jèrriais- singing pop band ever. OK, we're the only Jèrriais- singing pop band ever, but if there were others (unless they were Gallery models) we'd still be the sexiest.

WHO/WHAT INSPIRES YOU MUSICALLY?

Most of our music is taken from traditional Jèrriais folk songs which we then put our own twist on, generally by giving it a new beat and spicing it up a bit... The Badlabecques sound has been very much inspired by the Paul Simon album 'Graceland', anything by Fairport Convention, 'new' folk groups like the Lloyd Yates Band, and Quebecois bands like La Bottine Souriante and La Volée d'Castors.

Culturally, it's all about the Jèrriais – we started the band to help promote the language and Jersey culture (commissioned by L'Office Du Jèrriais), so it's inspiring to know our album is being used in schools to help teach Jèrriais.

We also like to have a good time – quite a few of the traditional songs are drinking songs so with 9 of us in the band it's a party everywhere we go, and we're inspired by the idea of getting people up and dancing to a language they can barely understand! V'là tch'est bien!

WHICH LOCAL ACTS DO YOU ADMIRE?

We're pretty good buddies with the Lloyd Yates Band as we share our percussionist, Polo, with them. We also had the privilege of having a guest slot on our album from Giles Robson (from the Dirty Aces) – he's just been voted the UK's top harmonica player. There's a bunch of great local artists in Jersey and we admire anyone who's ready to get up and have a go at making music...

IF YOU COULD PLAY ALONGSIDE ANYONE, WHO WOULD IT BE?

Well our lead singer, Kit, has already played with some pretty cool

people including Sir Paul McCartney and Mercury Prize nominee Thomas White, but as a band we'd love to share a stage with the brilliant Quebecois band La Volée d'Castors, or The Folksmen from 'A Mighty Wind' – that would be some jam session.

WHAT MAKES A GOOD GIG?

A good gig is all about the magic. The crowd, the venue, the sound, the band, the banter, the body chemistry... When you get those things right you can't help but have a good time.

We have a song called 'Rigodon d'Chorchel'lie' ('The Sorcerer's Rigadoon') which features various bits of Jersey folklore, magical beings, faeries, ghosts and of course the Black Dog of Bouley Bay. It starts off with a spell and by the middle of the song we always get the crowd to shout out as they dance – it's usually pretty magical, evoking the time when local witches and wizards used to gather down at Rocqueberg on a Friday night, consume a bit too much home-made cider and some of those special mushrooms you find up at Noirmont and generally have a good time... Allons, vé-t-en!

WHERE CAN THE JERSEY PUBLIC CATCH YOU PLAY? CAN THEY BUY YOUR MUSIC?

We're exited to be headlining at the Jersey Arts Centre on 9th February as part of their 'Festival 30', and shortly after that we'll be doing a mini 'tour swop' with an all-girl ukulele band from Guernsey, called Ukuladeez, so keep an eye on our website for details on that. Our debut album 'Hèque Badlabecques!' is out now and available from SeeDee Johns, White Label Records, Jersey Tourism, and various other places, as well as online.

We're proud to say 50% of the proceeds from the sale of the album will go to local community projects: (25% to the Société Jersiaise, for the promotion and development of the Jerriais language, and 25% to La Motte Street Studios, to help support local young musicians).

So we're not just the sexiest Jèrriais pop band - we're also the nicest.

ROGER SANCHEZ:

SUPERSTAR DJ... HERE WE GO!

Grammy-Award winning international DJ Roger Sanchez headlines Theology's second 'Quintessential' night at the Grand Jersey this month (February 2nd), in what is sure to be one of the highlights of Jersey's busy nightlife calendar. One of the most highlyregarded DJs on the planet, New York-born Sanchez has scored numerous hits with his own singles (2001's 'Another Chance' being his most widely known commercial success) and remixes of such A-list artists as Michael Jackson, Kylie Minogue, Madonna, Daft Punk and Jamiroquai, and is renowned as one of the slickest live DJs you'll ever see. Born to Dominican parents, his influences are a melting pot of global sounds, and his Quintessential set is sure to offer an eclectic mix of house, rock, techno and Latin flavours.

Gallery had an intercontinental chinwag with Roger as he kicked back at his Los Angeles home. Here's what he had to say about New York, EDM, HMV and lots, lots more...

Hi Roger, where are you, how are, and what have you been doing with your day today? Hi, I'm at home taking a short break from touring & writing in my studio.

You're coming to Jersey for the first time in February – what can people expect from your set? Does a lot of planning go into your sets or do you prefer to gauge the vibe as you play? I definitely prepare the music but I don't format my sets - I do prefer to feel out the vibe of the crowd. Every crowd is different!

What's your musical background, who were your early musical influences and how did you first get into DJing? I started out with Disco, Latin, Hip Hop & Jazz and got into House Music when it first emerged from Chicago. I used to be a breakdancer in High School & had friends who were DJs that inspired me to want to be doing what they were doing.

As a New Yorker, you must appreciate the rich musical history the city has. What do you think it is that breeds such musical diversity there? The diversity of the people that live in New York is truly reflected in the musical heritage each group brings and that, in turn, blends into an amazing musical tapestry.

This is a free-pronged question concerning the American 'EDM' explosion of the last 12 months... ...Firstly, in Europe a lot has been made of how Americans don't 'get' rave culture. Considering house music has its roots in the Chicago and Detroit scenes, do you think that's just European snobbery at work, or is there something in that assertion? I think the current 'EDM' scene in the US is very commercialised at the moment but also very young - there are pros and cons, but I think there is some validity in the feeling that the US doesn't understand the roots of dance culture this is new to the current audience and it's co-mingled with major artists and labels wanting to cash in on the latest popular craze.

There's also been a lot made of the suggestion that the amount of pop acts hiring in producers like David Guetta and Deadmau5 – or cheaper versions – has homogenized pop music in some way, and that as a result, there's less diversity in the pop charts. Would you agree? I think there is A LOT of sameness in pop music now; everyone uses the same synth sounds and patterns, but that is true of any style of music that becomes popular- it breeds replication!

The final of those three prongs is – is it okay for DJs to be held up as 'rock stars', or do you feel it should be the music that does the talking, with no frills? I think that if a DJ is an ARTIST – performing with creativity and engaging the audience – they should be treated accordingly. However, the music should ALWAYS do the talking!

Recently it's been big news in the UK that HMV, Britain's biggest chain of record shops, is to go into administration, which many are seeing as a final nail in the coffin for music in physical formats. Do you think it has a future, or do you think it's time we embraced the digital age and got on with it? I think the digital age has come quite some time ago

and we should always look forward but learn from the past. To me it isn't about the format – it's about the music!

Other than yourself of course, who's the greatest DJ out there, in your opinion? There are too many truly great and talented DJs in various genres to truly name one 'the greatest'. What would be the criteria? Mixing skills? Popularity? Fee Amount?

And which new up-and-coming DJs and producers that we might not have heard of, would you recommend people check out? Some of the new guys making noise are Mike Vale, DJ PP, Electronic Youth and Maya Jane Coles.

Finally, what are your plans for 2013? Putting family first, getting ready to release a ton of new music this year and focus even more on my label, Stealth.

Actually, finally, finally – what's the best joke someone's told you recently? I couldn't repeat it – it's FAR too dirty!


